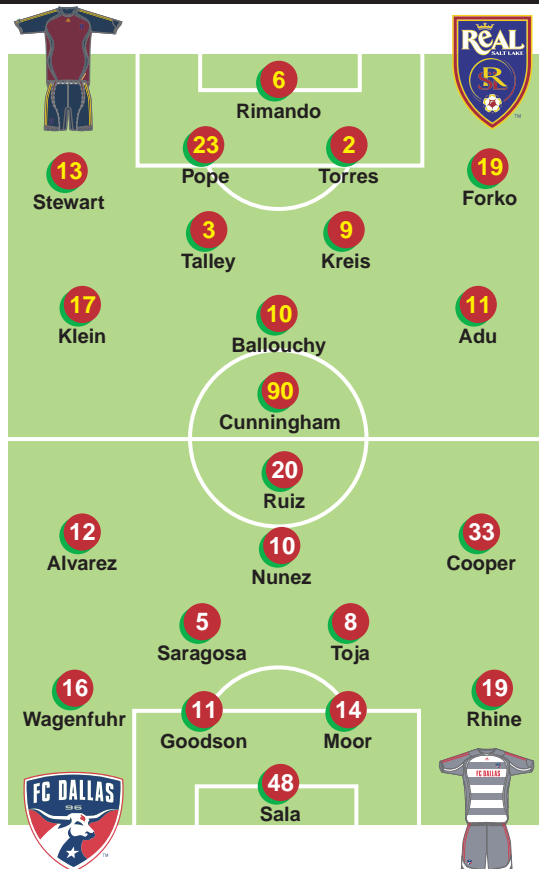

MLS Game #2

Two Western Conference clubs who finished on opposite ends of the division a season ago face off in their 2007 season opener. Real Salt Lake kicks off their third season aiming for a first-ever trip to the MLS Cup Playoffs. A year ago, FC Dallas won the regular season title in the Western Conference, only to be eliminated by the Colorado Rapids for the second season in a row and be denied the opportunity to play in a first MLS Cup Final in their own stadium.

- This is the first of three meetings between the teams this season, all in the opening three months of the league campaign. They meet for the only time this year at Pizza Hut Park on May 20, before concluding their league series on June 14 on the Wasatch Front.

- A year ago, FC Dallas claimed the season series between the clubs for the second year running, taking three of the four meetings, including both games in Frisco.
- Both of Real's victories against the Hoops have come at Rice-Eccles Stadium, a 3-0 on July 23, 2005 and the 3-2 victory on Sept. 16 of last season after going a man down.

REAL SALT LAKE

Real Salt Lake begins their third season looking to reach the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time ever. They've finished in fifth place in the Western Conference in both years of their history, a year ago ending level with the Los Angeles Galaxy two points out of the final playoff spot.

- Real concluded their preseason campaign last Saturday with a scoreless draw against the Colorado Rapids in Las Vegas. Colorado played a man down for the final 32 minutes of the contest after Brandon Prideaux was sent off for a second bookable offense, RSL nearly grabbing the win late in second-half stoppage time when Kenny Cutler hit the woodwork.
- Here's Ellinger's team: Nick Rimando – Jack Stewart (Nik Besagno 53), Eddie Pope, Danny Torres, Willis Forko – Chris Klein, Carey Talley, Jason Kreis (Kenny Cutler 67), Mehdi Ballouchy, Freddy Adu – Jeff Cunningham (Chris Brown 69).
- Coming out of the preseason, Ellinger is hoping his club gets off to a better start this season than it has in the first two. In their inaugural campaign, RSL went 1-3-2 in their opening six games; last year, they got out of the gate with a disastrous 0-5-1 mark, and failed to reach the playoffs both seasons.
- "To be honest, I'm more optimistic every year that we're going to come out of the starting blocks a lot better," said Ellinger to the Deseret Morning News. "I think we have a good core that has played a year together, and the fact that we've added several players who I think made us better. So optimistically, I feel we can get off to a better start and get our confidence early."
- Ellinger thinks, for starters, he has improved a defense that allowed 49 goals in 32 games last season, most in MLS.

- "Right now, Eddie [Pope] and Danny [Torres] have started to form an exceptional central defense corps," Ellinger said. "From what we've seen out of Nick (Rimando), he's playing very well and he's got something to prove. Defensively, we have more depth and more talent than we had the first two years, obviously, so I'm hoping if we keep our main guys healthy we'll be better. We'll try to score as many goals as we can, and if we can cut that goals-against number in half, than we'll be pretty successful as well."
- The club's biggest offseason news was the acquisition of Freddy Adu from D.C. United, and it was widely expected he would fill the attacking midfield role he coveted there. But in the preseason, Mehdi Ballouchy had laid claim to that spot in Ellinger's five-man midfield in the 4-5-1 scheme he's settled on during the preparation period.
- "Mehdi's been playing at a different level," said Ellinger to the DMN. "Right now we're able to put teams under pressure, more so than we were doing even last year even at the second half of the season. We've created a lot more chances."
- And that has meant a move to a wide position on the left for Adu. Ellinger admitted Adu wasn't pleased at first, but has now embraced the plan.
- "The initial plan was to stick him in the middle, but as the preseason goes on he seemed to be more valuable playing on the left," said Ellinger. "There was a point where he said, 'I'm not really feeling this position.' I tried to use the analogy that if it's good enough for Ronaldinho, it can be good enough for you, so he's adjusted to that. He feels pretty good now."

FC DALLAS

Steve Morrow begins his first season in charge of FC Dallas, who a year ago finished atop the Western Conference in the regular season, only to be dumped out of the MLS Cup Playoffs at the quarterfinal stage on home turf by the Colorado Rapids.

- FC Dallas concluded their preseason with a 1-0 loss to Brazilian outfit Clube Atletico Paranaense on March 31 at Pizza Hut Park, the return match of the USA/Brazil challenge matching the Hoops against their partner club. CAP defeated Dallas 3-1 at Kyocera Stadium in Curitiba, Brazil on March 7.
- In the 33rd minute, the visitors got the only goal they would need when CAP forward Ricardinho blasted a shot past Hoops goalkeeper Shaka Hislop for the only goal of the contest. The tally was set up when teammate and fellow striker Dayro Moreno had a perfect touch and found him on the left side of the field with a perfect angle to shoot at goal.
- Here's Steve Morrow's team on the night: Shaka Hislop - Bobby Rhine, Clarence Goodson, Drew Moor, David Wagenfuhr - Marcelo Saragosa (Pablo Richetti 64), Juan Toja - Kenny Cooper (Roberto Mina 63), Ramon Nunez (Abe Thompson 79), Arturo Alvarez (Dax McCarty 62) - Carlos Ruiz (Dominic Oduro 62). Substitutes not used: Ray Burse, Aaron Pitchkolan, Blake Wagner, Andrew Daniels
- Morrow was aiming to use the match against CAP as the final dress rehearsal before the season opener, and said that his first-choice lineup was on display – though he said there was still room for change.
- "I'm looking for those 11 guys to be playing together and have 90 minutes together as much as possible," Morrow said. "I want to give other guys an opportunity to push for a spot as well. There will be a mixture of getting the starting guys playing together and giving a few others chance to win a spot. I still think there are one or two spots still up for grabs and want to give guys the opportunity."
- As well, it was a final chance for Morrow's 4-2-3-1 system to go through a shakedown. The change in tactics – particularly in the attacking end – has met with widespread approval from the FCD players.
- "I like it (the new formation) because I have more players around me," said Carlos Ruiz, who was named team captain during the week. "I know I need to find spaces because with all of those players around me, I need to make good runs to find spaces behind the defense. When I have Ramon (Nunez), Kenny (Cooper), Roberto (Mina) and Arturo (Alvarez), I have good players around me. At any moment, they can give me a great pass that will allow me to try and score a goal."
- In addition, Ramon Nunez has started to make the playmaking role in the center of the park his own. "Steve is giving me the freedom to move around and go left, right or in the middle to get the ball. My job is to get the ball and make the team move," Nunez said. I felt like I was able to do that (against CAP). I was able to get a couple of shots off and create some opportunities, which is going to be my role this year."
- With goalkeeper Dario Sala suspended for the first six matches of the season, Morrow wasn't ready to concede the starting job to Shaka Hislop at the start of preseason. But the Trinidad & Tobago international has performed well of late and will be between the posts for the opener.
- "I think Shaka has been solid in the last few games," said Morrow. "We have only conceded one goal in the last few games. He's been a lot more solid and I think he's gradually getting back to full fitness. He's worked hard in the last couple of weeks with his sharpness in training and I think that's starting to pay off. I think come the weekend, he'll be ready."

- Morrow was also pleased with the holding midfield duo of Marcelo Saragosa and Juan Carlos Toja. While Morrow has made the addition of some steel into the backline a priority during the offseason, he also wanted to see it from his midfielders.
- "I think I did (see that toughness against CAP)," he said. "That's a strength for Marcelo. He's very competitive in the middle of the field. He showed tonight that he has a good partnership with (Juan Carlos) Toja and they balanced each other pretty well. Toja has both those qualities where he's great going forward and also showed tonight that he's very willing to work back."
- Despite the result, it was still a good final preseason match from the FCD point of view. "In so many ways, it seems that roles within the system are becoming more understood," said Bobby Rhine. "I think guys are asked to do certain things and are starting to understand what those things are. That was evident tonight for the most part."
- The Hoops will be without striker Roberto Mina, who suffered a knee injury the final preseason friendly against Paranaense. An MRI showed no damage. "It's nothing too serious," said Morrow to The Dallas Morning News. "Players can come back and play in about a week. He is so strong on his thighs, anyway, that I think he will recover quickly."

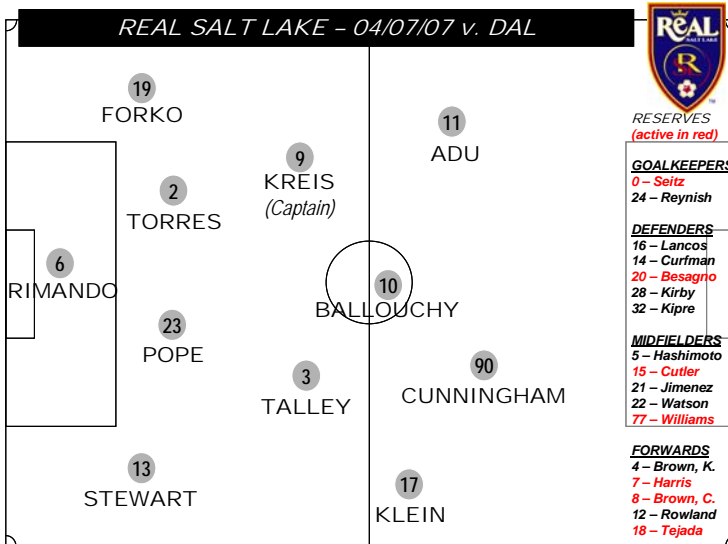

THEY CAN DISH IT OUT AND TAKE IT: “The Armory” might become a catchy name for Rice-Eccles Stadium in 2007, as Real Salt Lake has assembled one of the most impressive arrays of offensive weapons in MLS history, including three of the League’s top-15 active goal scorers ... While he’ll be featured in a holding midfielder role, you can bet the League’s all-time leading scorer, **Jason Kreis**, will find his way towards goal more than a couple of times a game when he’s not trying to set up defending MLS Golden Boot holder **Jeff Cunningham** (90 goals, 4th on active list) and 10-year-veteran **Chris Klein** (46 goals, 13th on active list) ...

RSL’s cache of attacking talent has proven unselfish over the years as well, as the team boasts half of the League’s top eight active assists leaders in Kreis (74 assists/4th place), **Andy Williams** (66 assists/5th), Cunningham (57 assists/6th), and Klein (53 assists/8th). Cunningham, Klein and newcomer **Freddy Adu** all finished in MLS’s top 10 in assists in 2006, and with the talented **Mehdi Ballouchy** serving as the main cog in RSL’s midfield, you can bet the second-year star will improve exponentially on the two helpers he posted during his rookie season last year ...

“WELCOME TO THE SLC”: Nine members of the current 28-man Real Salt Lake roster are getting their first taste of life on the Wasatch Front in 2007 ... Following is a breakdown on how the new nine-some landed in Salt Lake City over the off-season:

Via trade (3): MF Freddy Adu (from DC on 12/11/06), FW Kyle Brown (from NE on 1/12/07), and GK Nick Rimando (from DC on 2/09/07 ... and from NY on 2/23/07);

Via MLS SuperDraft (2): GK Chris Seitz (2nd overall) and DF Steven Curfman (30th overall);

Via MLS Supplemental Draft (2): GK Kyle Reynish (43rd overall) and DF Dustin Kirby (49th overall);

Via signing (2): DF Chris Lancos [from FC Kaiserslautern II (GER III) on 1/31/07] and FW Luis Tejada [on loan from Plaza Amador (PAN) on 12/14/06] ...

"LINE CHANGE" BETWEEN THE POSTS: It was a busy off-season for RSL Assistant/Goalkeeper Coach **Peter Mellor**, who watched his entire goalkeeping corps turn over since the end of last season. While **Scott Garlick** (retirement), **Jay Nolly** (trade to DC) and **Chase Harrison** (waived), all went out the revolving door, the RSL technical staff certainly made the goalkeeping position a priority in the off-season, setting the situation right by getting a trio of proven winners in **Nick Rimando**, **Chris Seitz**, and **Kyle Reynish** ... Between the three netminders, one has won a championship each of the past three falls after Rimando guided D.C. United to its fifth MLS Cup title in 2004 and Seitz and Reynish led the Maryland Terrapins (2005) and UC-Santa Barbara Gauchos (2006), respectively, to the last two NCAA College Cup crowns ... The veteran Rimando, who the club re-traded for in late February after the sudden retirement of Garlick, will assume the starter's role for RSL and build upon career numbers of 145 games played, 145 games started, 66 wins, 573 saves, and 36 shutouts that all place sixth in the League's annals in addition to a ninth-ranked 1.32 goals against average ... Seitz, the 2nd overall selection in January's MLS SuperDraft, will serve as the back-up, but Reynish will have his chance to fill that role when Seitz joins the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team for the FIFA World Youth Championships in Canada in June and July ...

ARE YOU EXPERIENCED?: The most noticeable difference between years one and two of Real Salt Lake was the influx of veteran players brought in by the club for its second go-around, including the likes of **Jeff Cunningham**, **Chris Klein** and **Carey Talley** ... When you combine those four "old-timers" with the likes of MLS originals **Jason Kreis** and **Eddie Pope** and veteran playmaker **Andy Williams** and **Chris Brown**, who joined the club for its inaugural season, and you have plenty of leadership and experience to lead the way in the 2007 campaign ... Among those seven players, the five players projected to be in the opening day starting XI on Saturday rank among the top 15 active MLS players in games played - Kreis (301 GP/2nd), Cunningham (239/T-6th), Klein (232/10th), Pope (227/14th), and Talley (226/15th) ... Need experience off the bench? Then just call in Williams (198) and Brown (175) ...

RSL VETERANS READY TO GET IT STARTED: Feeling jitters prior to any match - especially Opening Day - is normal, but don't expect that of Real Salt Lake, which has five players who have appeared in at least eight of the previous 11 MLS First Kick weekends, including MF **Jason Kreis**, whose 10 Opening Day appearances are tied for the third most in League history, ranking behind only the recently retired **Chris Henderson** and New England's fountain of youth, **Steve Ralston** ... RSL MF **Andy Williams** has been on the field during nine season openers (T-7th), while **Jeff Cunningham**, **Carey Talley**, and **Chris Klein** have been a part of eight (T-9th) prior season kick-off contests

THE FREDDY FACTOR: The fact that all eyes will once again be on midfielder **Freddy Adu** when the 2007 MLS season kicks off on Saturday is nothing new - but everything else for the 17-year-old phenom will be ... Since joining Real Salt Lake in December, Adu has had to adjust to a new setting, system, position, and locker room, but the one familiar factor is RSL Head Coach **John Ellinger**, who coached Adu at the U.S. Under-17 Residency Program in 2002-2003 and will hope a happy and hungry Adu emerges from the start this season ... Despite his impending absence with the U.S. U-20 squad that will participate in the FIFA World Youth Championships this summer, Adu will likely shatter the record for the youngest player to hit the 100-games played plateau for an MLS player later this season, a record reset just last season when Chicago's **Justin Mapp** hit the century mark at 21 years, 340 days of age ...

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: With all that experience around, the squad remains well-balanced thanks to six players that will be age 20 or under when Real Salt Lake's third season kicks off on Saturday ... That contingent is headed by the two youngest players to be drafted in MLS history in 17-year-old **Freddy Adu** and 18-year-old **Nik Besagno**, while a bevy of 20-year-olds round out the list - **Steven Curfman**, **Christian Jimenez**, **Chris Seitz**, and **Jamie Watson** (who turns 21 next Tuesday) ...

THE WORLD'S FAIR (FOR THE TAKING): Real Salt Lake's opening day roster will have plenty of international flavor, as eight of its 28 players were born outside of the United States ... The foreign wealth is well spread out, as the squad boasts three players from the Caribbean, two from Central America, and three from Africa - not including trialist **Jean-Martial Kipre** of the Ivory Coast ... RSL's talented list of players of foreign descent includes (citizenship in parentheses): **Freddy Adu** (Ghana/U.S.), **Mehdi Ballouchy** (Morocco/U.S.), **Jeff Cunningham** (Jamaica/U.S.), **Willis Forko** (Liberia/U.S.), **Atiba Harris** (St. Kitts & Nevis), **Luis Tejada** (Panama), **Danny Torres** (Costa Rica), and **Andy Williams** (Jamaica/Canada/U.S.).

GET MO' ON YOUR SIDE: RSL enters the 2007 season hoping to continue its second-half form of last year, when the squad dropped just 4 of its final 16 games, going 7-4-5, earning 26 of its 39 points on the season and outscoring opponents ... RSL was unbeaten in five of its last six games to close out the season, but the glut of ties as the team went 1-1-4 prevented a playoff berth ...

RSL has never won its opener, earning its first-ever road point in a 0-0 draw at NY in a Nor'easter in the team's inaugural game on April 2, 2005, before dropping a 0-3 decision at Chivas last year ...

EXPANSION PLAYOFF HISTORY: RSL made dubious history last year, as every MLS team since 1996 has reached postseason play in one of its first two seasons in the league ... RSL FW **Jeff Cunningham** become the first man to win the Budweiser Golden Boot and be forced to stay home for the playoffs ... Cunningham's 16 goals left him two goals shy of the most goals ever scored by a player on a non-playoff team, a feat belonging to Raul Diaz Arce, who scored 18 goals for the 1998 New England Revolution ...

HOME SWEET HOME: RSL is unbeaten in 11 of its last 13 home games, going 6-4-6 last year, outscoring opponents 23-19 ... The team's all-time home record in MLS play is now 11-12-9, scoring 42 goals to the opposition's 43 ... Eight of the team's 12 home losses have been by one goal, while 10 of RSL's 13 overall losses in 2006 also had a one-goal margin ...

NEVER SAY DIE: With an increased focus on fitness in 2006, RSL earned more than one-third of its points – 17 of 39 overall – in second-half, come-from-behind fashion ... RSL led MLS in goals scored during the 2nd half, with 34 of its 45 goals in the final stanza for an average of 1.07 per game (nine total goals better than CHI and KC, who each have scored 24 in the 2nd half) ...

In the decisive final 15 minutes of play, RSL boasted a league-best 15 of its 45 goals on the season scored in the 76th minute or later ... The final 30 minutes have also been good to RSL, as 28 of the team's 45 goals were scored in the final half-hour ... RSL was the lone team to own multiple wins when trailing at the half in 2006, boasting a 4-4-2 mark ... Only Dallas and Chicago won even once when down after 45 minutes ... RSL also owned the best MLS mark when allowing the first goal, going 4-9-6 in that situation ...

RSL TRIFECTA BANKS WINNING WAYS: In eight games last year, RSL scored 3+ goals, after hitting the trifecta just once in 2005 ... RSL is now 7-0-2 when scoring 3 or more, something it has done both at home (5 occasions) or away (4 times) ... Six of the 8 offensive outbursts have come in the last 14 games ... During its 32-game inaugural season, RSL scored 3+ goals just once, striking three times in the first 30 minutes at home vs. FC Dallas on 7/23/05 to win 3-0 ... The 3-2 win v. DAL on 9/16 also marked the first time this year that RSL scored 3+ without FW **Jeff Cunningham** in the lineup ... Dates, opponents and scorers:

RSL had won 4 of its last 5 one-goal games before Saturday, after winning just 3 of its first 20 ... Last season, RSL was just 1-6 on the road in contests decided by one goal ...

GOOD TIME FOR A CLEAN SHEET: When shutting out the opposition, RSL is 5-0-3 all-time, including a 2-0-2 mark in 2006 ... Half of Garlick/RSL's shutouts last season came vs. LA, with the 3-0 win on 5/13 at LA and on 8/30 ... RSL also has a pair of 0-0 draws in 2006, both at home: 6/28 vs. NE and 7/4 vs. CHV ...

LINEUP SHUFFLE CONTINUES: Due to injuries, suspensions, international duty and schedule congestion entering the Kansas City game, only eight times in RSL's 64-game history had the same lineup remained intact in back-to-back games ... Last season, a total of 143 games were lost to RSL due to suspension, international duty or injury:

Although Cunningham had started 12 consecutive games prior to his Sept. injury, and 24 of 28 overall for RSL, he continues to lead MLS all-time in goals off the bench, as only five players have even half as many goals as a substitute ... The all-time leaders: **Cunningham, 19**; Wolde Harris, 13; Pete Marino, 12; Welton, Hristo Stoitchkov, and A.J. Wood, 9 ...

Cunningham surpassed teammate **Jason Kreis'** MLS mark for contribution to his team's success (set in Dallas in 1999), either scoring or assisting on nearly 62% of RSL's goals (he also sent the rifled cross in the box that CHI DF Dasan Robinson knocked in for an own goal on 6/3) ... the all-time top 10:

CUNNINGHAM DICTATES RSL PACE: 31 of RSL's 39 points last year were earned in a game when Cunningham either finds the back of the net or assists on an RSL goal; when he was held scoreless, RSL is 2-11-4) ... On the season, RSL was 8-2-2 when Cunningham scores, losing @ DAL 9/23 and @ HOU on 4/22 ... The pair of wins without a goal by Cunningham coming 9/16 vs. Dallas during his yellow-card suspension and on 8/16 at Columbus, when he fed an onrushing **Carey Talley** in the game's 90th minute for the game-winner in a 2-1 victory ...

12 of Cunningham's 16 goals last year came during the run of play, with 4 via penalty kick ... The game-winning goal 8/30 v. LA was his 28th in his nine MLS seasons, ranking him #2 all-time (Kreis, 31; Razov, 28), as he is now 4-for-4 on PK's this season for RSL and 13-for-14 all-time ... Amazingly, the only PK miss of Cunningham's career came in 2005 for Colorado in a game in which he already had three goals (06/18/05 @ CHV) ... Cunningham has scored AND assisted in the same game 18 times in his 240-game MLS career ... The multi-goal game on 8/9 in Colorado was Cunningham's second straight two-goal effort and third consecutive game with a goal ... It marked the 14th multi-goal game of his career, and Jeff's fourth-ever for RSL (5/13 @ LA, 6/3 v. CHI, 7/29 v. DC and 8/9 @ COL)

CUNNINGHAM FOCUSED ON CENTURY

MARK: Cunningham helped Real Salt Lake to a 4-1-0 MLS record last August, scoring 4 goals and adding 4 assists to seize the lead in the race for the Budweiser Golden Boot ... Ultimately, he became the first-ever RSL player to be honored as an MLS Player of the Month ... The Jamaican-born U.S. international played a part in 8 of the team's 10 August goals, as RSL moved into fourth place in the Western Conference with just 7 games remaining in 2006 season ...

In leading RSL to 12 of a possible 15 points in August, Cunningham notched 2 game-winning goals (8/9, 8/30) and tallied 2 game-winning assists (8/16, 8/19) as RSL defeated conference rivals Colorado, Houston and Los Angeles and established club record streaks for wins (four games) and undefeated runs (five games) ... The 4 goals scored during the month give Cunningham 89 in his nine-year MLS career, surpassing **Roy Lassiter** and moving within shouting distance of **Ante Razov**, **Jaime Moreno** and **Jason Kreis** among all-time MLS scoring leaders ... 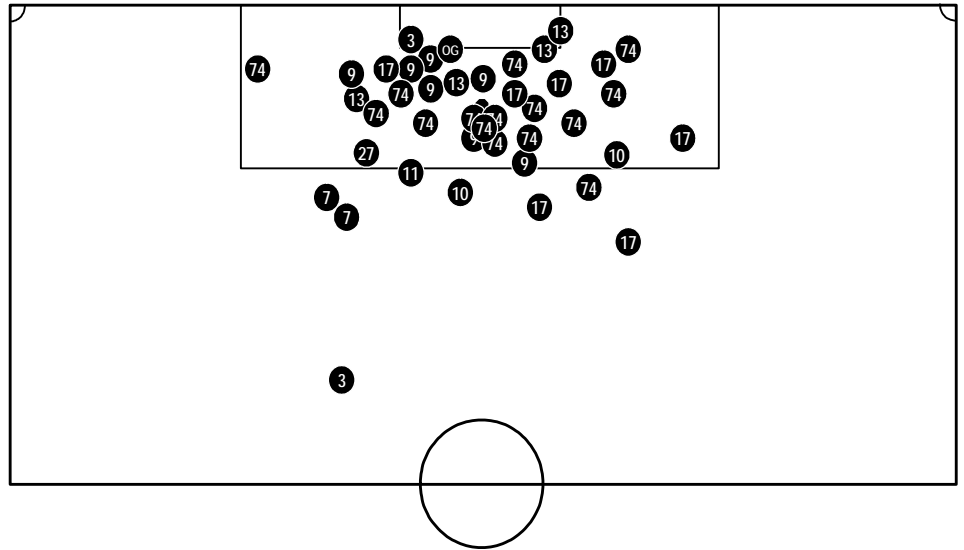

CLINCHING VS RSL: FC Dallas has clinched its place in the past two MLS Cup playoffs with a win over RSL in their last meeting of the season – both times at Pizza Hut Park. On Sept 23, 2006, FCD beat RSL 2-1, in turn becoming the first team in the Western Conference to clinch a berth in the playoffs. Kenny Cooper and Carlos Ruiz each scored for FCD, which broke a three-game losing streak at the time...On Sept. 18, 2005, Roberto Mina scored two goals to help FCD defeat RSL 2-1, also clinching a playoff berth with the win.

SUSPENDED: Dario Sala, who started the first 28 games in goal for FCD in 2006, is suspended for the first six games of the 2007 regular season. Sala was involved in an altercation following the team's playoff loss to Colorado on Oct. 28, 2007 – and was fined and suspended by MLS...Defender Chris Gbandi, who was named the team's 2006 Defender of the Year, received a red card in that same game and must sit out tonight's match.

THOMPSON'S FIRST IS 500: On July 22, 2006, Abe Thompson scored his first goal of the season in the 93rd minute to give FC Dallas the 1-0 win over Real Salt Lake at Rice-Eccles Stadium. It was the 500th goal in FC Dallas history, making FCD the third club in league history to score 500 or more goals in its history at the time.

SHAKA'S DEBUT: FCD goalkeeper Shaka Hislop made his MLS debut against RSL on Sept. 23, 2006 – making three saves in earning his first win (2-1). Hislop played the final four regular season games in 2006 while Dario Sala recovered from a calf injury. In those four games, Shaka won both home matches by a 2-1 score – but was on the losing end of two road games, surrendering eight goals combined; Sept. 30, L 3-1 at CLB and Oct. 14 lost 5-2 at LA.

SHAKA IN THE BOOKS: Shaka is already the oldest Dallas goalkeeper to play, start, complete and win a game – which he did so towards the end of last year. At 38 years and 45 days, he is 28 days away from being the oldest player to ever suit up for Dallas. That distinction is currently held by Mexico's current National Team head coach Hugo Sanchez, who was 38 years and 73 days old when he played his final game for Dallas on Sept. 22, 1996 at Los Angeles. Shaka would need to play in at least one game in May to reach this milestone. The first game in May is on the 12th – which is the team's 7th of the season – the same game in which Dario Sala is eligible to return from suspension.

Shaka will become the 7th keeper to start a season opener: Mark Dodd started in 96, 97; Garth Lagerway – 98; Matt Jordan – 1999-2003; Scott Garlick – 2005; and Dario Sala – 2006.

NOTE: The oldest Dallas keeper to record a shutout is Mark Dodd, who was 33 yrs., 275 days old when he shutout DC on June 16, 1999.

MINA SITS OUT: Forward Roberto Mina is sitting out tonight's game with a strain left MCL. After playing the last 27 minutes of the final preseason game on March 31 against Brazilian-side Atletico Paranaense, Mina began training with the team on Monday. However, after experiencing pain in his left knee, he was removed from practice. An MRI on his knee showed the strained ligaments. He will be monitored daily and his return is on a week to week basis.

KEEP AN EYE ON... FC Dallas was 10-0-1 when Kenny Cooper scored a goal in 2006 (actually 11-0-1 if one counts the Open Cup win vs. Charleston.)...

ROSTER MOVES: FC Dallas had 31 total players during the 2006 season, with 25 of the 28 roster players still on the team at the end of the year. Starting the 2007 season, 19 of the 28 players that were on the 2006 opening day roster are still with the team.

CAPTAIN FISH: Carlos Ruiz – who was named the team captain April 2 – enters the 2007 season with 74 career regular season goals scored (9th all-time) and 15 career playoff goals scored (1st all-time). His 89 combined goals over the last five seasons are seven more than second-place Taylor Twellman. Only five players in MLS history have reached 100 career combined goals:

STARTING ON THE ROAD: Heading into this year, FC Dallas had been the only team to begin each of the first 11 MLS seasons with a home game. This year is the first in which FCD begins on the road. FCD is 6-3-2 in home / season openers, and 3-4-4 in the first road game of the season - including 2-0-4 over the last six years.

In the 2006 season (and home) opener, FCD twice came from behind to defeat the Chicago Fire 3-2 at Pizza Hut Park. In his first game with the team, former Dallas high school star Kenny Cooper entered the game in the 65th minute and scored the game-winning goal five minutes later.

In the first road game of the year, FCD took a 2-0 lead at Colorado before conceding a penalty and own goal that tied the game.

OPENING RHINE: Defender Bobby Rhine is entering his 9th MLS season - all of which have been with Dallas. As he is expected to be in tonight's starting lineup, it will be only his 4th opening day start of his career. As you see below, the team is 1-1-1 when Bobby starts on opening day. Here's his line in the team's opening game of each of his first 8 seasons:

DID YOU KNOW: the average age of the current 29-man roster is 23.59 years old...That includes the 38 year old Shaka and 15-year old Abdus Ibrahim.

FIVE VETERANS MOVE ON: Five veterans that were part of the team's opening roster in 2006 are no longer with the team.

- GK Jeff Cassar has stopped playing and taken the role of the team's goalkeeper coach...
- M Simo Valakari did not have his optioned picked up and is now playing in his native Finland.
- M Ronnie O'Brien was traded to Houston for Adrian Serieux and a 2nd round pick in Nov. 2006.
- D Greg Vanney was traded on Draft day to Colorado in exchange for the Rapids 2007 Second Round selection (18th overall) and their natural second round selection in the 2008 MLS SuperDraft.
- M Richard Mulrooney was traded to Toronto in March 2007 for allocation money and Toronto's first round pick in the 2008 SuperDraft.

ADRIAN WAITS: Defender Adrian Serieux is recovering from off-season knee surgery. He played with left knee pain for the entire 2006 season while with Houston. However, upon his arrival to Dallas this January, the pain did not subside. The Dallas doctors further analyzed his situation and determined that he had Osteochondritis Dissecans (OCD). In this case, OCD is essentially a bruise to the medial (inside) end of the femur bone that either never fully healed or was caused as a result of repetitive smaller injuries. He is expected to return in June / July.

THE ABDUS STORY: Forward Abdus "Ibee" Ibrahim was selected by Dallas with the 1st pick in the 2nd round (14th overall) in this year's SuperDraft. Dallas had acquired that selection from Toronto in the Serieux / O'Brien trade. At 15-years old, he was the second youngest player to ever enter MLS (Freddy Adu was 14 when drafted by DC).

Abdus is currently with the U.S. U-17 team in residency in Bradenton, Florida. He will remain with that team through the U-17 FIFA World Cup this summer.

An agreement was reached with MLS that will make Abdus the 29th player on the team (the 11th player on the Developmental Roster). Abdus will be eligible to play in MLS Reserve Division Games, but not regular season games this year. FCD will bring him in to train as much as possible, and is still in talks with MLS to make him eligible to play in Open Cup and SuperLiga games.

DANIELS TO STAY IN SCHOOL: FCD has also permitted rookie Andrew Daniels to finish school at Brown University before he joins the team on a full-time basis in late May. Daniels is expected to join the team in NY next weekend for a Reserve Division game against the Red Bulls.

KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR....In 2006, FC Dallas became the second team in MLS history to go an entire season without taking a penalty kick (KC, 2000). Only one PK was called in any of FCD's 32 games – that being awarded to Colorado off a Dallas handball on Apr. 15, which technically counts as a foul. For the year, Dallas finished with 476 fouls committed and were fouled 426 times by opponents. Of the 902 fouls, the handball was the only infraction to happen inside either of team's penalty box.

FCD's last penalty kick in a regular season game was on September 24, 2005, when Ramon Nunez scored against Pat Onstad in Dallas' 1-1 tie against the San Jose Earthquakes.

WINNING FROM THE SPOT: Despite not being awarded a penalty kick during the regular season, FCD twice won games in 2006 on penalty kicks (and also lost one). On July 26, FCD defeated Tigres 5-4 on PKs after each team won their home leg of the Rio Grande Plate 2-0. On Aug. 2, FCD again won on PKs, this time defeating the Charleston Battery 5-3 on PKs after tying the 4th Round U.S. Open Cup game 3-3....the team's only blemish-losing to the Rapids in PK's in the MLS Cup Playoffs on Oct. 28.
