The Galaxy are playing the third game of a four-game homestand, having split the first two after a late loss to Toronto FC last weekend. The defending MLS Cup champion Dynamo come into the match still looking for their first league victory of the season, with a pair of draws their last two times out.

- This is the first of two meetings between the clubs this season, the only one at The Home Depot Center. The Galaxy will make their lone trip to the Space City when the teams meet at Robertson Stadium on Oct. 18.

- The teams split their three meetings a season ago, playing to a scoreless draw to kick off the campaign, then each winning on the other's home ground.
- The Galaxy have never defeated the Dynamo in a league game at The Home Depot Center. After playing to a scoreless in Houston's first-ever trip there, the Orange have come away with victories in their last two trips to Carson.
- But the Galaxy have come away with points from their last three trips to Houston – a 1-0 result before a crowd of 70,550 at Reliant Stadium (fifth-largest for a regular season game in league history) on Aug. 9, 2006 coming before last year's results.
- The only time the home team has won in the series came in the first matchup ever, a 2-1 Dynamo win on June 3, 2006 at Robertson Stadium. The Galaxy did win in a U.S. Open Cup semifinal at The Home Depot Center in 2006.

LOS ANGELES GALAXY

The LA Galaxy lost for the second time in three games on the young season, their first at home, as Toronto FC got a late game-winner for 3-2 victory Sunday afternoon at The Home Depot Center. The Galaxy have three points from their first three matches, fifth place in the Western Conference, a point behind Real Salt Lake and three behind the Colorado Rapids.

LAST MATCH

- The LA Galaxy were home for the second of four matches in a row after winning for the first time the week before against San Jose. Toronto FC were concluding a three-game road swing to open the campaign, after losses in Columbus and at D.C. United.
- Danny Dichio put TFC into the lead in the 42nd minute. Amado Guevara looped the ball into the Galaxy penalty area, and after a missed clearance, Dichio turned and drove the ball inside the far post.
- But it took barely a minute for the Galaxy to respond. Chris Klein picked out Landon Donovan with a long pass, he juked around a TFC defender and hit a low drive past TFC 'keeper Greg Sutton for the equalizer.
- Yet the Reds moved back in front again in the 53rd minute. Laurent Robert hit a piledriver of a freekick directly on goal that Galaxy 'keeper Steve Cronin could only parry, and Jarrod Smith was quickest to the rebound and headed home.

- It took just five minutes for the Galaxy to respond again. This time a cross was played in from the right and Marco Velez slipped and fell while trying to clear, and referee Alex Prus ruled the TFC defender handled the ball as he fell on the ball. Donovan drove the ball past Sutton to level terms again.
- But two minutes from the end Toronto FC took a lead they did not give up. A long ball from Robert was claimed by Jeff Cunningham in a one-on-one battle with Galaxy defender Greg Vanney, and the veteran striker ripped a low drive from outside the area that found the back of the net and gave TFC the win.
- Galaxy boss Ruud Gullit made no changes to the team that knocked off the San Jose Earthquakes 2-0 nine days earlier for the first win of the season.
- Here's Gullit's team (4-4-2): Steve Cronin – Chris Klein, Sean Franklin, Greg Vanney, Mike Randolph – David Beckham, Alvaro Pires, Brandon McDonald (Peter Vagenas 77), Ely Allen – Landon Donovan, Alan Gordon (Edson Buddle 68). Substitutes Not Used: Michael Gavin, Troy Roberts, Josh Tudela, Josh Wicks, Abel Xavier
- "I'm disappointed because we played so well. Sometimes football is unfair. They had three chances and they scored three," said Gullit. "It's a law in football if you don't convert the possibilities you have then the opposition feels like they can sniff something. That's the consequence of not being able to bury this game early."

TEAM NEWS

- The Galaxy easily could have been ahead 3-0 going into the halftime break, but instead, the game was tied at 1-1 and Toronto never trailed. Donovan also missed three one-on-one chances with TFC goalkeeper Greg Sutton in the first half.
- "I'm obviously disappointed. I'm disappointed in myself, having three chances like that can change the game," said Donovan. "We did well to get back in it twice. Then I think we were a little naïve in the end. We probably should have just settled and gotten out of here with a point."
- After working on their shape and possession following the loss in Colorado, the Galaxy felt they took a step backward, especially in the second half, against Toronto.
- "It was the same for both teams. It was extremely hot out there," said David Beckham. "When you don't keep the ball well and you don't pass the ball well it brings all sorts of problems. We lost our shape in the second half, partially through some of it the heat, but the majority of it from giving the ball away."
- Still, the Galaxy came away with two goals for the second consecutive match – and could have come away with more.
- "That's what it's all about. Creating chances and having the confidence of finishing them off. As long as I'm creating chances and Ely [Allen] on the left is creating chances, at some point we are going to score," said Beckham. "It's about putting the goals away, and hopefully that will start soon. We still created a lot of chances today. Landon got two. It just wasn't enough in the end."
- Losing shape also put the Galaxy at risk for some defensive breakdowns, allowing three goals to a team that had scored just one in its first two.
- "If you see how the game developed, you don't talk about defense, because we were playing well. They had one chance, we made a mistake, and immediately it was a goal," said Gullit. "It's frustrating. It was unnecessary. All three goals were unnecessary goals. That makes it hard to accept, especially because you were so much better."
- Gullit maintained the same lineup, meaning Sean Franklin kept his place in central defense ahead of Abel Xavier, who was suspended for the San Jose match. "I think that Sean played well today also. He wasn't involved in any of the balls that resulted in goals. He did his job," Gullit said. "If we scored all the possibilities we had, we wouldn't even be talking about this. The goals that we gave away were incredibly sloppy."

HOUSTON DYNAMO

The Houston Dynamo are still looking for their first victory of the season, getting a tie for the second successive week, this time a scoreless draw with the Kansas City Wizards on the road on Saturday evening. The Dynamo have two points from their opening three matches, sitting in sixth place in the Western Conference, four points off the pace of the division-leading Colorado Rapids.

LAST MATCH

- The Wizards were playing their final home game for two months, with two wins and a loss thus far in their season-opening homestand, while Houston Dynamo were looking for a first league win of the season after being eliminated from the CONCACAF Champions' Cup at midweek with a 3-0 loss to Deportivo Saprissa in Costa Rica.
- There were no goals on the night, but goalkeeper Kevin Hartman of Kansas City and Houston's Tony Caig were called upon for their share of heroics.
- The closest either team came was early in the second half when Brad Davis was sent through by Dynamo playmaker Dwayne De Rosario. Hartman's could only turn Davis' blast onto his own post, but was able to scramble back and smother the rebound.

- Dynamo head coach Dominic Kinnear made four changes to his team from the one that played to a 3-3 draw against FC Dallas after the midweek trip to Costa Rica. Tony Caig was still in goal for the injured Pat Onstad, while Ricardo Clark made his return to the Dynamo lineup after finishing out his league suspension. Brian Mullan and Brad Davis also reclaimed their spots in the midfield, as Craig Waibel was injured and Corey Ashe and Geoff Cameron returned to the substitutes' bench.
- Here's Kinnear's team (4-3-1-2): Tony Caig – Richard Mulrooney, Bobby Boswell, Eddie Robinson, Wade Barrett – Brian Mullan, Ricardo Clark, Brad Davis (Geoff Cameron 72) – Dwayne De Rosario – Franco Caraccio (Stuart Holden 71), Brian Ching. Substitutes Not Used: Corey Ashe, Kyle Brown, Chris Wondolowski, Patrick Ianni, Corbin Waller
- "We attacked well tonight. We created some good chances, We got some good looks, obviously Kevin (Hartman) makes a good save," Kinnear said. "I think we had enough chances to bag ourselves a goal."

TEAM NEWS

- For the Dynamo, it was already their third scoreless draw of the season in all competitions. They played to goalless results in each round of the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, on the road at CSD Municipal in the quarterfinals, and at home against Deportivo Saprissa in the semifinals.
- "It happens. We've had a couple of those already this season," Kinnear said. "The game against Saprissa at home, we had a lot of chances. Sometimes they fall, sometimes they don't."
- In seven games in all competitions in 2008, the Dynamo have been shutout in five. In the other two, they scored three goals in each.
- "I thought we probably had more chances than they did. We needed to be a little bit more clinical in front of the goal and we could have come up with a couple of goals," Kinnear said. "The effort of the guys all around was excellent. We kept on pushing for the win at the end and defended well in the second half. Sometimes you score, sometimes you can't and tonight we couldn't score."
- For 34-year-old Tony Caig, the clean sheet was a welcome sight. In his Dynamo debut, coming on as a substitute for injured Pat Onstad, he allowed goals on the first three shots he faced in an eventual 3-3 draw with FC Dallas. Then he was beaten for three goals by Saprissa.
- "It will be nice to get more touches because unfortunately my first touch with this team was picking up the ball out of the back of the net," said Caig. "But those are the kinds of things that comes with the territory of being a 'keeper. I have a lot of experience and I have been around. I just know and realize that when I am called upon I have to be consistent and put on a good display."
- Onstad is still unlikely to figure for the Dynamo this weekend. In addition, Houston will be without center back Eddie Robinson after he was suspended three matches and fined \$1,000 for an incident involving Tyson Wahl during the Wizards match. Robinson was not called for a foul on the play, but in its ruling, the MLS Disciplinary Committee decided that the incident involved unnecessary contact of an egregious nature by Robinson to Wahl's head, which constitutes a red card offense.

LANDON TIED AT THE TOP: Following his two-goal performance against Toronto FC on Sunday, Galaxy forward Landon Donovan is now tied for the MLS lead with three goals. Donovan and Kenny Cooper of FC Dallas have each scored three times in three games for their clubs this season, leaving them one goal ahead of a group of eight players that have two goals on the season.

Donovan now has 35 goals in 74 career regular season games for the club, leaving him tied with Mauricio Cienfuegos for third place all-time in goals for the club. The 26-year old is also just four goals shy of equaling Ronald Cerritos' career mark of 71 goals, which is good for tenth place all-time in MLS.

DONOVAN DOUBLES UP: Donovan's two-goal performance against Toronto was the eighth multi-goal game of his Galaxy career and the 15th of his MLS career, placing him into a four-way tie with Jeff Cunningham, Jamie Moreno and Taylor Twellman for the most in MLS history. Only Ante Razov (22) and Carlos Ruiz (17) have more multi-goal games than Donovan who has scored twice or more against nine of the 14 teams currently in MLS. However, he has scored just once in five games against the Dynamo, with that goal coming in a 2-1 home loss on Sept. 10, 2006.

KLEIN HITS 250: Galaxy defender Chris Klein made the 250th start of his MLS career on Sunday against Toronto, making him the 11th player in MLS history to achieve that feat. The 11-year veteran from Indiana University has started each of the last 176 regular season games in which he has appeared, including all 24 he played for the Galaxy. The last time that Klein, who began his career in Kansas City in 1998 before spending a year and a half with Real Salt Lake, did not start a game in which he played was on July 7, 2001 when he came on at halftime of the Wizards 2-1 win over New England, scoring the game's opening goal.

Since joining the Galaxy in June 2007, Klein has played every minute of every regular season game in which the club has played. His 250 starts rank fourth amongst active players while his 267 all-time games played are the ninth most in league history and are fifth amongst active players. In that time, Klein has scored 48 goals and added 58 assists, including one on Landon Donovan's first half goal against Toronto last weekend.

BUDDLE MAKES 2008 DEBUT: Edson Buddle became the 17th different Galaxy player to enter a game this season when he came on for Alan Gordon in the 68th minute of the 3-2 loss to Toronto last weekend. Buddle, who missed six weeks during the preseason with a shoulder injury that he suffered against Sydney FC at the Pan Pacific Championship, played the final 22 minutes against his former club and nearly rescued a point for the Galaxy only to see his shot sail just wide late in second half stoppage time.

The 26-year old New York native has now appeared in 161 games during his eight-year MLS career, scoring 53 times. He finished second on the Galaxy in goals in 2007, scoring five in 16 appearances for the club.

With Buddle's appearance, only eight players who are currently on the Galaxy roster (not including recent signings Vardan Adzemian and Scott Bolkan) have not appeared in a game this season. Goalkeepers Charles Alamo (injured), Vito Higgins and Josh Wicks have not seen the field, nor have defenders Ante Jazic (injured) and Julian Valentin, midfielder Josh Tudela and forwards Bryan Jordan and Israel Sesay. Of the players in that group, Alamo, Higgins, Jazic, Sesay and Valentin have not been named in an 18-man squad while Jordan, Tudela, and Wicks have all been on the substitute's bench at least once.

ALL IMPORTANT THIRD: Last weekend, Toronto's game-winning goal in the 88th minute was their third of the match, giving them a 3-2 victory. This season the Galaxy have already given up three or more goals on two occasions while their seven goals allowed are the second most in MLS. Since the abolishment of the shootout prior to the start of the 2000 season, the Galaxy are 2-27-2 in regular season games in which they have allowed three or more goals, with both wins and both draws coming in either the 2000 or 2001 campaigns.

The Galaxy have been even better when scoring three or more goals in a game, going 35-1-2 in those games since the start of the 2000 regular season. LA's only loss when scoring three or more came on August 18, 2007 when they fell 5-4 to the New York Red Bulls.

THE SAME LOOK: With no new injuries or suspensions picked up in last week's loss to Toronto FC, Galaxy head coach Ruud Gullit could potentially use the same starting XI for the third consecutive match. The last time that the Galaxy used the same starting lineup in three or more consecutive games was from Sept. 10 through Oct. 7 at the end of the 2006 season when Frank Yallop was able to use the same lineup for five consecutive matches. Only four of the 11 players who started those five matches are still with the club, while only two, Landon Donovan and Alan Gordon, are scheduled to be in the starting lineup for Saturday night's match.

DRAFT PAYS IMMEDIATE DIVIDENDS: It seems as if the Galaxy have received the most immediate rewards from January's SuperDraft and Supplemental Draft as they have had four players who were selected in the two drafts play already this season. Sean Franklin, Ely Allen and Brandon McDonald were all take in the SuperDraft and have started at least one match for the Galaxy, as has Michael Gavin who was taken in the first round of the Supplemental Draft.

The Galaxy are tied with the Kansas City Wizards for having the most players taken in the SuperDraft play already this season with three, however, the combination of Allen, Franklin and McDonald have appeared in eight games with seven combined starts, compared to K.C.'s combination of Roger Espinoza, Jonathan Leathers and Chance Myers who have played in seven game while making five starts.

Gavin is one of two Supplemental Draft picks, along with the Red Bulls' Danleigh Borman, to have played in an MLS regular season game this season, with both players having started one game and come on as a substitute in a second.

GALAXY SIGN AND LOAN TWO: On Monday, the Galaxy signed defenders Vardan Adzemian and Scott Bolkan to their Developmental roster, bring their roster total to 27, one shy of the MLS maximum of 28. Both players were then loaned to the Portland Timbers of the USL First Division, with whom they had been training for much of the preseason.

LA GALAXY GAME NOTES – April 19, 2008

BRAVO RETURNS: Galaxy Director of Soccer Paul Bravo is back in Southern California following a ten-day trip to South America. Bravo traveled to Brazil following the Galaxy's 2-0 win over San Jose in the home opener and watched a number of players there while also visiting with a series of clubs, including Serie A sides Gremio and Internacional, as well as fellow Sao Paulo club, Juventude of Serie B, during his time there.

TRIAL EXTENDED FOR THREE CUBANS: Former Cuban Under-23 National Team players Yordany Alvarez, Yenier Bermudez and Juan Manuel Miranda, will continue to train with the Galaxy through the end of this week at least. The trio began training with the club last week after arriving from Miami on Monday morning and impressed the coaching staff enough to all be invited back for a second week of training.

GALAXY'S ROAD TO OPEN CUP BEGINS: The LA Galaxy's quest for a third Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title will begin at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 27 when they host the Colorado Rapids in an Open Cup Play-In Game at The Home Depot Center. If they win this game, the Galaxy will then need to win one more Play-In Game, against a yet to be determined MLS opponent, in order to qualify for the Third Round of the Open Cup. This is the second straight year in which the Galaxy will play in an Open Cup Play-In Game. In 2007, the Galaxy traveled to Columbus and defeated the Crew 1-0 before beating the New York Red Bulls 3-1 in extra time at The Home Depot Center to qualify for the Third Round of the Open Cup, where they were defeated by the Richmond Kickers 1-0.

GALAXY vs. HOUSTON: The Galaxy and Houston Dynamo have played seven times in the regular season, with the Galaxy claiming a 2-3-2 record in the series. However, both of the Galaxy's wins have come in Texas, meaning that LA is 0-2-1 all-time against Houston at The Home Depot Center in the regular season. LA's only home win over Houston came in 2006 in the semifinals of the U.S. Open Cup as Alan Gordon, Landon Donovan and Santino Quaranta scored in a 3-1 win over the Dynamo.

This is the only meeting of the two sides at The Home Depot Center this year while the Galaxy travel to Texas on October 18 to take on the Dynamo at Robertson Stadium.

FAMILIAR FACES ACROSS THE BOARD: The visiting Dynamo come to town with three familiar faces as defender Craig Waibel, midfielder Brian Mullan and forward Brian Ching now ply their trade in Houston after getting their start in LA. The trio combined to appear in 60 games for the Galaxy between 2001 and 2002, making 31 starts while scoring six goals and adding seven assists. Mullan and Waibel were each part of LA's 2002 MLS Cup winning side while those two and Ching helped the Galaxy reach the 2001 Cup Final. However, only Mullan appeared in either of those games, coming on as a second half substitute in the loss to San Jose in 2001.

RESERVES BACK IN ACTION ON SUNDAY: With a record of 0-1-1, the LA Galaxy Reserves will go in search of their first win of the new season when they host the Dynamo Reserves (0-0-0) on Sunday morning (10 a.m.) at University Field #1 at The Home Depot Center.

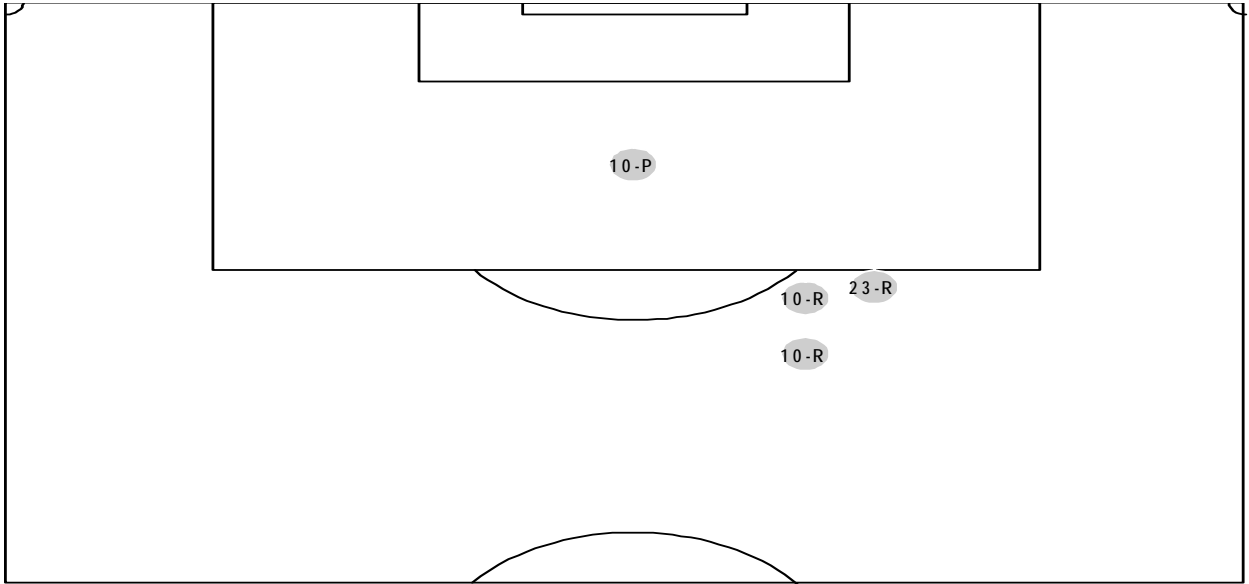

On the road again

The Dynamo continue their busy travel schedule with a Saturday night match against the Los Angeles Galaxy at the Home Depot Center. The Dynamo are 2-1-1 all-time against the Galaxy at the Home Depot Center, including a 2-0-1 record in MLS play.

Houston is 0-2-2 on the road this year, including matches in Guatemala and Costa Rica. Saturday is Houston's first road match against a Western Conference opponent.

Up Next: Hard work ahead

The Dynamo will play their fourth consecutive road match next Saturday, traveling to Crew Stadium to take on the Columbus Crew. Houston is 1-0-3 all-time against Columbus, with the only win coming by a 2-1 margin at Crew Stadium last year. The Dynamo will return home to Robertson Stadium to face Chivas USA on May 3.

Recent action: Dynamo, Wizards play to scoreless tie

The Dynamo earned their second consecutive tie in MLS play last Saturday, playing to a scoreless tie on the road against the Kansas City Wizards. English goalkeeper **Tony Caig** celebrated his 34th birthday on Friday night and made four saves Saturday night to earn his first Dynamo shutout. For Houston, **Eddie Robinson**, **Brian Mullan**, and **Brad Davis** all returned from injury to start, and midfielder **Ricardo Clark** played his first MLS game since September 2007 due to suspension.

Dynamo still not at full strength

After a rash of injuries during pre-season and the opening few weeks, Houston's depth will continue to be tested in the next several games. Goalkeeper **Pat Onstad** (shoulder) and defender **Craig Waibel** (hamstring) are both expected to miss Saturday's match, and defender **Eddie Robinson** will serve the first of a three-game suspension.

Captain consistent reaches 200 mark

Left back **Wade Barrett**, the team's captain since its inception, reached an MLS milestone Saturday against Kansas City by making his 200th career start in MLS play.

Barrett has been a remarkable fixture in the Dynamo lineup over the last two years. Of the team's 89 games in competitive competitions (MLS, playoffs, Open Cup, Champions' Cup, SuperLiga), Barrett has started 87. He missed one game in 2006 due to yellow card accumulation and the Open Cup contest in 2007, in which most starters were rested.



Where's Waibel?

A quick check of the record books reveals that Dynamo right back **Craig Waibel**, who missed the MLS season opener due to a hamstring sprain, is virtually indispensable. With Waibel on the field, Houston has an all-time record of 30-15-19 in all competitions, and that includes the April 9 Champions' Cup loss in which Waibel was substituted after only six minutes. The Dynamo are 8-9-8 without the fan favorite in the starting lineup or as a substitute.

Old rivals meet again

Many Dynamo players have enjoyed success against Los Angeles, including memorable rivalry games between the Galaxy and the San Jose Earthquakes. Midfielder **Dwayne De Rosario** has had the most success against L.A., scoring seven goals and adding four assists in 19 career games. That does not include his game-winning overtime goal against the Galaxy in the 2001 MLS Cup final or his playoff numbers.

In all, 10 former Earthquakes who currently play for the Dynamo have played at least 11 games against Los Angeles, led by **Richard Mulrooney** (25) and **Wade Barrett** (24). Midfielder **Brad Davis** has three goals and five assists against the Galaxy, while **Brian Ching** has played only 11 games against Los Angeles but has scored twice.

Cup veterans switch squads

While six players who played in the 2001 MLS Cup final between Los Angeles and San Jose are on rosters for Saturday's game, **Dwayne De Rosario** is the only one who has remained with his squad since.

Former Earthquakes **Wade Barrett** and **Richard Mulrooney** both left the team and later returned, Barrett to San Jose in 2005 and Mulrooney to Houston in 2007. **Landon Donovan**, meanwhile, won MLS Cup titles with the Earthquakes in 2001 and 2003 but moved to Los Angeles in 2005.

On the other side, **Greg Vanney** left the Galaxy to play for Bastia in France but has since returned by way of Dallas, Colorado and D.C. United. **Brian Mullan** was traded from the Galaxy to the Earthquakes for the 2003 season and has been a mainstay in the San Jose and Houston lineups since.

Dynamo Trials kick off

The 2008 Dynamo Trials, presented by LALA, kick off Saturday morning and continue all day with the fitness tests for the roughly 500 players slated to try out. Players will be tested with three specific fitness tests, and those who reach a professional status will be invited to the skills tests on April 26. Players from more than 30 countries have registered to try out. Houstondynamo.com and media partner Univision will have all the news from the Dynamo Trials.
