The Houston Dynamo make their first league visit to the Bay Area to take on the San Jose Earthquakes, returning to the roots of the club. After 10 seasons in California, the San Jose club moved to Texas to become the Dynamo, and the Earthquakes were reborn this year as an expansion club. The Earthquakes come into the game still looking for their first victory before their home fans, while the Dynamo have won two games in a row after starting defense of their back-to-back titles, won in their first two years in Houston, winless in their first six games.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

ALL-TIME: First meeting

- This is the first of three meetings between the clubs this season that share their ancestry. They will not meet again until mid-September when they play each other on back-to-back weekends in a home-and-home series, Sept. 13 at Buck Shaw Stadium and then Sept. 20 in Houston.
- The San Jose Clash were one of the founding clubs of Major League Soccer in 1996, changing their name to the Earthquakes for the 2000 season. In 2006, the club relocated to Houston, but the name, colors and competition records of the Earthquakes were retained for the expansion team that began play this season.

SAN JOSE EARTHQUAKES

The San Jose Earthquakes saw their winless streak reach four games after their lone win on the campaign after a comprehensive 2-0 loss to the New England Revolution last Saturday evening. The Earthquakes sit in seventh place in the Western Conference with four points from seven matches, four behind the fifth-place tie between Chivas USA and Real Salt Lake.

LAST MATCH

- The defending Eastern Conference champion Revolution were looking to put together back-to-back wins for the first time on the season, while the Earthquakes has lost twice and drawn once since the first victory in their return to MLS.
- The Revolution were two goals to the good before the match was a quarter old. In the sixth minute, Steve Ralston drove in a low free kick from the right and it skimmed off the bottom of Shalrie Joseph's boot, holding it just enough for Kheli Dube to sweep in behind and thump it into the net for his first professional goal.
- Calamity then struck as the lead doubled the lead in the 23rd minute. A free ball was bouncing behind the Earthquakes backline and as Joe Cannon came off his line to collect, former Revolution defender James Riley - on his return to his one-time home -- tried to head the ball back to his 'keeper, but instead powered it high over his head and into the goal.
- The Earthquakes were kept to just a single shot on goal for the entire match, that coming in the 90th minute. They went close again in the game's final minute, but Ramiro Corrales saw his drive ring off the crossbar.
- Earthquakes head coach Frank Yallop made two changes to the team that lost 3-2 to the Columbus Crew the weekend before. Ryan Cochrane returned from injury, but came in for Nick Garcia, who was out to injury. Peguero Jean Philippe was also out injured, as Joe Vide came into the lineup in his place.
- Here's Yallop's team (4-4-1-1): Joe Cannon – James Riley (Shea Salinas 57), Ryan Cochrane, Jason Hernandez, Eric Denton – Ronnie O'Brien (Ryan Johnson 46), Ramiro Corrales, Joe Vide, Ivan Guerrero (John

- "We didn't do ourselves any favors by coming out so flat," Quakes goalkeeper Joe Cannon said. "One of the problems with this team is that we're a little bit too reactionary with our actions. We wait for something to happen before we do something about it."

TEAM NEWS

- Coming into the season, the strength of the Earthquakes was expected to be their defense. But after conceding just five goals in their first five games, including two clean sheets in a three-game span, San Jose has allowed five goals in their last two games.
- "You go away from home and give up a goal early and you tend to think you're in for a long night. Both goals were preventable, to be honest. It was a free kick into the box that wasn't dealt with by our defenders and then an own goal. (It was just a) bad start," Yallop said.
- Trying to get back into the game, Yallop changed his tactics. He went to back three, moving James Riley to a wide right-sided role while tucking Ronnie O'Brien inside, along with Joe Vide and Ramiro Corrales.
- "We had to change the system a bit to try to get to grips with it. We sort of seemed to get a bit better," Yallop said. "It wasn't a good performance. At least we didn't roll over and die at the end. That was important."
- While Ryan Cochrane was back from injury, Nick Garcia was out with a groin strain. More troubling: In a team short on attacking options, Yallop was missing both Gavin Ginton and Peguero Jean Philippe to injury, who have 26 career MLS goals between them.
- "I said to everyone at halftime that it's about character," Yallop said. "We're not going to win every game. We don't have a full squad. Nick Garcia being out was a challenge for us. That's probably the worst we've played since the LA game. We're disappointed. We need to pull up our socks and be ready to go."
- It also was not the homecoming Riley had envisioned. After three seasons in a Revolution uniform, going to three consecutive MLS Cup Finals, Riley moved to San Jose in the expansion draft. But on his first game back in his old stadium, he looped a header past Cannon for an own goal.
- "I don't really know [how it happened]," Cannon said. "He finished it pretty well. Give him credit. I was off my line a little bit and he put a lot of power on it. Unfortunately, he put it into our net. At that point, it was kind of the exclamation point of the half."
- After the break, Yallop tried to inject some life into his team with a pair of changes, bringing on Shea Salinas as he went with two out-and-out strikers and also bringing on Ryan Johnson, who scored his first career goal the weekend before against Columbus.
- "Johnson and Salinas did a good job," Yallop said. "There were some bright spots from our subs, but New England was cruising at that point. They weren't too worried that we were going to get back in the game at that point."

HOUSTON DYNAMO

The Houston Dynamo came back for their second win in as many matches, getting a late winner for a 2-1 win on the road at Chicago Fire on Saturday evening. The Dynamo have 10 points from eight matches and now sit in third place in the Western Conference, just a point behind second-place LA Galaxy and two behind division leader Colorado Rapids.

LAST MATCH

- The Fire had won three games in a row and five of their last six, entertaining a Houston Dynamo team that finally put an end to their six-game winless run to start defense of their title the weekend before.
- The Dynamo took the lead after 17 minutes. Ricardo Clark let fly from outside the area; his shot deflected off the boot of Fire midfielder Chris Rolfe and Dwayne De Rosario instinctively poked out his head to divert it again, Jon Busch left completely helpless as the ball flew into the goal.
- But the Fire levelled the score in the 28th minute. Cuauhtemoc Blanco swung in a free kick from the right corner and Calen Carr rose up to powerfully head down, the bounce taking the ball past Pat Onstad and over the clearing attempt of Wade Barrett.
- In the second half, the rain began lashing down in Bridgeview and the Dynamo scored the winner eight minutes from the end. Richard Mulrooney hooked in a quick free kick from the right flank and Bobby Boswell got up to nod home a looping header for his first goal since joining the Orange.
- Dynamo coach Dominic Kinnear kept the same team for the second consecutive week, the same one that recorded a 2-1 draw against Colorado at home the weekend before.
- Here's Kinnear's team (4-3-1-2): Pat Onstad – Richard Mulrooney, Bobby Boswell, Eddie Robinson, Wade Barrett – Brian Mullan, Ricardo Clark, Stuart Holden – Dwayne De Rosario – Franco Caraccio (Kyle Brown 68), Brian Ching. Substitutes Not Used: Chris Wondolowski, Tony Caig, Geoff Cameron, Patrick Ianni, Guy-Roland Kpene, Craig Waibel

- "I think our attacking group played well. From the first minute their movement, they created some good chances," Kinnear said. "Like last week, we didn't finish our chances, but at the same time it's good that you can create these new chances, and it's going to turn where you do finish them."

TEAM NEWS

- Playing in a constant, sometimes driving rain, against a Fire team that was enjoying its best season start ever, the Dynamo would not have been blamed for playing for the draw. But they had the run of play in the second half and put five shots on goal to just one for the Fire in the second 45 minutes.
- "(The winning streak) is a reward for how the team is working," Kinnear said. "Before that, we had some games we were playing well, playing on top of teams, and we just didn't get the result. The results are going our way now."
- The Dynamo hit for two goals against a Fire team that had allowed just three in its first seven games – and one of those through an own goal.
- "This is a team where we are capable of winning every game we step on the field," Boswell said. "We don't come in here to destroy the game and play for a draw. We want to win. We have our goals, to score goals and not give them up."
- The first Dynamo goal was originally credited to Clark. However, video evidence showed the ball took two deflections on its way to goal, first hitting Fire midfielder Chris Rolfe before De Rosario thrust out his head to touch it again – something confirmed later by both players. "I'll take it," De Rosario said. "I don't get easy goals anymore."
- Despite the talk of it being the second-poorest start for a team defending its MLS title, the Dynamo have now pulled into a .500 record and sit within striking distance of taking over the Western Conference lead by the end of the weekend.
- "I think we have just been unlucky with our results early in the year," Boswell said. "The breaks just weren't going our way. Or we were making one mistake here or there. But things are going to even out over a matter of time."
- For 10 Dynamo players, this will be their first match back in San Jose since the club left northern California and they went with it: goalkeeper Pat Onstad; defenders Wade Barrett, Eddie Robinson and Craig Waibel; midfielders Ricardo Clark, Brad Davis, Dwayne De Rosario and Brian Mullan; and forwards Brian Ching and Chris Wondolowski.
- Eight players were part of teams that won MLS Cups in each city. De Rosario won all four MLS Cups in the timeline of the club – with San Jose in 2001 and 2003, and Houston in 2006 and 2007. Richard Mulrooney won three (2001 and '03 with SJ; 2007 with HOU), as Barrett (2001 with SJ; 2006, '07 with HOU), and Ching, Mullan, Onstad, Robinson and Waibel won three different ones (03, 06, 07).

Misc. Notes

Vide Into Lineup

Midfielder Joe Vide made his first start as a member of the Earthquakes on Saturday, May 17 against New England. He started alongside Ramiro Corrales at center midfield and played 90 minutes. He had appeared in two games as a sub this season prior to that match.

Glinton in Germany

Quakes forward Gavin Glinton traveled this past weekend to Munich, Germany, where he underwent successful surgery to repair a sports hernia. Dr. Ulrike Muschaweck performed the surgery at Hernia Centre Munich on Saturday, May 17. Glinton returned to the Bay Area on Sunday, May 18 and joined his teammates at training on May 20.

Garcia Misses First Game

Earthquakes captain Nick Garcia missed his first match of the season on May 17 at New England. He sat out the match with a right groin strain. He is listed as probable for Thursday's match against Houston.

Former Quakes Meet Current Quakes

This will be the first official meeting between the Earthquakes and the Houston Dynamo. After the 2005 season, the Earthquakes relocated to Houston to become the Dynamo. Major League Soccer announced on the day of the relocation that San Jose would retain the Earthquakes name and history for a future expansion team. In 2006 and 2007, the Dynamo, operating as an expansion team, won back-to-back MLS Cups. At the 2007 MLS All-Star Game, MLS awarded Lew Wolff an expansion team for the Bay Area. The expansion team carries the San Jose Earthquakes' name and history, including the MLS Cup titles won in 2001 and 2003.

Quakes/Dynamo Exhibitions

Although this will be the first official meeting between the two teams, the Earthquakes and Houston Dynamo met twice in one week during the preseason. Before their trip to Hawaii for the Pan Pacific Championship, the Dynamo made a stop along the way to the Bay Area to meet the expansion Quakes. The first meeting was on Feb. 13 at PAL Stadium in San Jose. Houston's Ricardo Clark scored the only goal of the match to give the Dynamo the 1-0 victory in the Quakes first match since 2005. The teams would meet again three days later on Feb. 16 at Kezar Stadium in San Francisco. The Quakes and the Dynamo ended the game with a 0-0 draw.

Quakes Bring Back Two from the Dynamo

During the offseason, the Quakes brought two members of the Houston Dynamo back to San Jose. Quakes General Manager John Doyle and head coach Frank Yallop made defender Ryan Cochrane the first pick of the 2007 MLS Expansion Draft. San Jose originally drafted Cochrane in 2004 after playing for Santa Clara University for three seasons, and he played for San Jose in 2004 and 2005. Cochrane then relocated with the Dynamo to Houston, where he helped the Dynamo win the 2006 and 2007 MLS Cups. The Quakes also brought back Bruce Morgan as the team's head athletic trainer. Morgan, who went with the Dynamo when they relocated to Houston, is the only person that has been part of every Clash/Quakes game since the team's first game on April 6, 1996.

Earthquakes Support the Nothing But Nets Campaign

The Earthquakes and Major League Soccer's community outreach initiative, MLS Works, are teaming up with the UN Foundation's Nothing But Nets campaign in an attempt to cover an entire continent with long-lasting insecticide-treated bed nets. Malaria is the leading killer of children in Africa and every 30 seconds a child dies from malaria. Cannon Among the All-Time Leaders

Earthquakes goalkeeper Joe Cannon is among the all-time league leaders in Major League Soccer history in a number of goalkeeping categories. He is currently tied for fourth all-time in MLS in appearances (223), fourth in minutes (20,085), fourth all-time in saves (933), third all-time in shutouts (58), fifth all-time in wins (85) and tied for seventh all-time in goals against average (1.30). For San Jose goalkeepers, Cannon is first in club history in appearances (108), first in minutes played (9,891), first in saves (465), first in wins (47), first in shutouts (28) and second in goals against average (1.26) and saves percentage (74.4). He also holds the team's all-time record for saves in a game with 12 on July 8, 2000 at Colorado.

San Jose in May

The Quakes are now 20-22-1 all-time in May in MLS play.

Quakes in May

Eric Denton has notched five of his 19 career assists in the month of May ... May has typically been a big month for Ronnie O'Brien as he has four goals and eight assists in 22 career games in the month.

Corner Kicks

The Earthquakes and Columbus Crew combined for 25 corner kicks May 10 at Buck Shaw Stadium, setting a club record for combined corner kicks in a regular season game. The previous Quakes record for combined corner kicks was 21, set on Aug. 5, 1998 in a match against the New England Revolution. Columbus also set an opponent's record for corner kicks in a game and a half against San Jose. The Crew had 18 corner kicks with 11 of them coming in the second half.

Scoreless Streak Snapped

The Earthquakes scored two goals against Colorado on April 19 with the last coming in the 61st minute. The team then went 251 minutes without scoring a goal prior to the match against the Columbus Crew. The streak was snapped Saturday against the Crew when Ramiro Corrales scored in the 42nd minute.

Biggest Crowd at Buck Shaw

The game between the Earthquakes and FC Dallas on May 3 was a standing room only sellout at Buck Shaw Stadium with 10,515 people in attendance. That crowd set a record for the largest soccer crowd in Buck Shaw Stadium history. The previous high was 8,800, which happened twice during the 1996 Women's College Cup at Buck Shaw. The game also marked the first appearance by the Quakes at the stadium. The Quakes have previously played games in the Bay Area at Spartan Stadium in San Jose, Stanford Stadium in Palo Alto and Candlestick Park in San Francisco. The Quakes played the majority of their home games at Spartan Stadium from 1996-2005. The team played the first three games of 1998 at Stanford, while Spartan Stadium underwent renovations, and then played at Stanford on July 4, 1999 in a doubleheader with the U.S. Women's National Team during the 1999 FIFA Women's World Cup. The Quakes also played an exhibition against Club America at Candlestick Park on Sept. 18, 2002. Earlier this season on April 12, the team played its first ever game in Oakland at McAfee Coliseum.

Quakes Above .500

The Earthquakes all-time MLS record is above the .500 mark. The Quakes all-time regular season MLS record is 135-130-48. They had the third-best regular season record in MLS history at the conclusion of the 2005 season at 134-125-47.

Halftime Success

The Earthquakes remain amongst the best in league history in holding onto a half-time lead despite losing to the Columbus Crew 3-2 on May 10. That game marked the team's first loss since 1999 when holding a halftime lead. Since the beginning of the 2000 season, the Earthquakes are now 49-1-8 in games when leading at the half, including 8-0-1 in 2003, 7-0-1 in 2004, 7-0-3 in 2005.

Record Unbeaten Streak At Home Snapped

The Earthquakes set an MLS record with their August 7, 2004 win against D.C. United, extending their unbeaten streak at home to 46 games when scoring first. That streak reached 57 games after San Jose's 2-2 tie with Real Salt Lake on October 8, 2005. However, after scoring first against the Columbus Crew on May 10, 2008 the Quakes fell 3-2, halting the streak at 57. The Quakes had not lost at home when scoring first since April 3, 1999.

Making the First One Count

The Quakes scored first, but lost to the Columbus Crew on May 10. That loss marked their first defeat when scoring first since July 4, 2004 against the Los Angeles Galaxy. The Earthquakes own a 62-4-9 record in their last 75 matches when they score the first goal of the game. In 2005, San Jose went undefeated at 14-0-5 when scoring first. The Earthquakes were 25-2-2 in 2001 and 2002 when finding the back of the net first. The Quakes only gave up leads two times in 2002, losing 2-1 to Los Angeles on July 4 and falling 2-1 to Kansas City on July 27. The team continued that trend in 2003, possessing an 11-0-1 mark in the regular season when they scored the first goal. In 2004, the Quakes went 8-1-1 when scoring first, the top mark in MLS. The Quakes gave up their lead and lost to Los Angeles on July 4, 2004 for the first time since July 27, 2002 against Kansas City. The Quakes are also impressive in the playoffs when scoring first, posting a 6-0-0 record.

Scoring First Under Yallop

During Frank Yallop's first tenure with San Jose, the Earthquakes were one of the best teams in the league when scoring the first goal. The team went 36-2-1 from 2001-03 when scoring the first goal of the game. The Quakes only gave up leads two times in 2002, losing 2-1 to Los Angeles on July 4 and falling 2-1 to Kansas City on July 27. Yallop is now 1-1-0 in 2008 when scoring first after losing to the Columbus Crew on May 10.

Return to San Jose: Dynamo back in town

The Houston Dynamo bring a two-game win streak into their first meeting with the expansion San Jose Earthquakes, the former club for 11 current Dynamo players and head coach **Dominic Kinnear**, who were with San Jose before the team moved to Houston for the 2006 season.

Recent action: Dynamo douse Fire

The Dynamo won their second consecutive game Saturday with an impressive 2-1 road triumph over the Chicago Fire at Toyota Park. Houston handed Chicago its second loss of the season and scored almost as many goals (2) as Chicago had allowed in its first seven games (3). The first goal came in the 17th minute, when a long-range shot from **Ricardo Clark** bounced flukily off a Chicago defender and **Dwayne De Rosario** before going in. Defender **Bobby Boswell** netted the game-winner with a header in the 82nd minute from a Richard Mulrooney free kick.

Dynamo vs. San Jose – series notes

- This is the first competitive game ever between the two franchises. The teams did play twice in pre-season in California, with the Dynamo going 1-0-1 against the Earthquakes. **Ricardo Clark** scored in the Feb. 13 win, and the teams played to a scoreless tie Feb. 16.
- There are myriad connections between the two teams, however, since the two stars worn over the San Jose logo were won by many of the players now wearing Dynamo orange. On the current Dynamo roster, 11 players were once members of the Earthquakes, combining to win 11 MLS Cup titles. **Dwayne De Rosario** and **Eddie Robinson** are the only players who have been a part of all four San Jose / Houston MLS Cup championship teams.
- Dynamo head coach **Dominic Kinnear** played for the San Jose Clash in 1997, was an Earthquakes assistant coach from 2001-03, and was the San Jose head coach in 2004 and 2005.
- Additionally, five more Dynamo players hail from California, including **Erik Ustruck**, who went to Santa Clara, and **Nick Hatzke**, whose hometown is San Jose.
- San Jose defender **Ryan Cochrane** was an original Dynamo player who won MLS Cup titles with Houston in 2006 and 2007.
- The 11 Dynamo players who played for the Earthquakes are: **Wade Barrett** (1998-2002, 2005); **Brian Ching** (2003-05); **Ricardo Clark** (2005); **Brad Davis** (2005); **Dwayne De Rosario** (2001-05); **Brian Mullan** (2003-05); **Richard Mulrooney** (2000-04); **Pat Onstad** (2003-05); **Eddie Robinson** (2001-05); **Craig Waibel** (2003-05); **Chris Wondolowski** (2005).

Onstad among elite company

Dynamo goalkeeper **Pat Onstad** joined an elite club of MLS goalkeepers on Saturday, making four saves in the win over Chicago to run his career total to 500 saves, the ninth goalkeeper in league history to do so. His 35th-minute save on Bakary Soumare was the 500th of his career. Onstad currently ranks ninth in league history, just four saves behind No. 8, Mark Dougherty, who had 505 career saves. The Canadian international, now 40 years old, has the best career goals against average in MLS history with a mark of 1.07. Onstad led the league last year by allowing 0.82 goals per 90 minutes and finished second with 11 shutouts.

Captain consistent carries on

Left back **Wade Barrett**, the team's captain since its inception, reached an MLS milestone May 10 against Colorado by appearing in his 210th career MLS game. Earlier this year, on April 12, Barrett made his 200th career MLS start against Kansas City.

Barrett has been a remarkable fixture in the Dynamo lineup over the last two years. Of the team's 94 games in competitive competitions (MLS, playoffs, Open Cup, Champions' Cup, SuperLiga), Barrett has started 92. He missed one game in 2006 due to yellow card accumulation and the Open Cup contest in 2007, in which most starters were rested.

Barrett has played at least 2,500 minutes in his last four MLS seasons (2002, 2005-07).

Scoring first would help

In 55 games in Major League Soccer this season, the team scoring first is 41-2-8, with four games ending in scoreless ties. Responsible for two of those 0-0 draws, the Dynamo improved to 2-0-2 when scoring first with Saturday's win over Chicago.

Ashe heads to France

Midfielder Corey Ashe was named to the United States U-23 squad for the Toulon International Tournament in Toulon, France, and is unavailable for Thursday's game. The tournament runs from May 20-29, so Ashe, formerly a U.S. U-17 international, could miss up to four games while making his debut with the U-23 team.

The Dynamo Reserves, currently 2-0-1 and in first place in the Western Conference of the MLS Reserve Division, return to action Friday morning against the San Jose Earthquakes.
