The defending two-time MLS champion Houston Dynamo make their first visit to RFK Memorial Stadium since winning MLS Cup six months ago, when they take on Supporters' Shield holders D.C. United on Wednesday night. Since lifting the trophies a year ago, both teams have struggled this season. United endured a four-game losing streak before a win and a draw in their last two, while the Dynamo opened the season winless in their first six games, though three wins in their last five games have pulled them within a point of the top of the Western Conference.

- This is the first of two meetings between the teams this season, the only one set for RFK Stadium. They will conclude their season series on Oct. 12 at Robertson Stadium.

- The teams split the season series against each other, once again each winning on their home ground.
- In the four all-time meetings between the clubs, the home team has won all four. United has outscored Houston 4-1 in the two games at RFK Stadium, while the Dynamo have won a pair of 1-0 decisions over the past two years in the Bayou City.
- The Dynamo, of course, did win for the first time at RFK Stadium in last November's MLS Cup Final, defeating the New England Revolution 2-1.

**D.C. UNITED**

D.C. United once again weren't able to follow a win with another victory, as the New England Revolution came back to claim a 2-2 draw on MLS Primetime Thursday at Gillette Stadium. United have 10 points from 11 matches and still sit at the bottom of the Eastern Conference, one behind the Kansas City Wizards and two behind the New York Red Bulls.

**LAST MATCH**

- The Revolution came into MLS Primetime Thursday riding a three-game winning streak, while D.C. United had put an end to a four-game losing streak the weekend before with a home win against Toronto FC.
- United looked to have continued their turnaround with a rampant opening 45 minutes, but had only one goal to show for it. Clyde Simms came to drive a short clearance back goalward, facing a good reaction save from Matt Reis, but Luciano Emilio dove to head home the rebound for his second goal in as many games.
- Still, United doubled their lead eight minutes after the second-half restart. A blocked shot was corralled by Jaime Moreno, whose shot was then saved by Reis. But Fred popped up outside the left post to thump the rebound back home.
- Yet the Revs responded six minutes later to halve the deficit. Mauricio Castro's cross from the left wasn't cleared and the ball deflected to Kheli Dube, who slid a pass into Adam Cristman and watched as the substitute slid the ball past Zach Wells.

- And the Revolution pulled level in the 72nd minute. Steve Ralston flighted in a free kick from the right flank, Jeff Larentowicz got up at the back post to nod it back across the face of goal, and Dube swept in to head it home from point-blank range for an unlikely share of the points.
- United head coach Tom Soehn made one change to the team that defeated Toronto FC the Saturday before. With Gonzalo Peralta remaining in Washington to attend to his pregnant wife, Domenic Mediate came into his place in central defense.
- Here's Soehn's team (4-3-1-2): Zach Wells – Bryan Namoff, Devon McTavish, Domenic Mediate, Gonzalo Martinez – Santino Quaranta, Clyde Simms, Fred (Marc Burch 88) – Marcelo Gallardo – Jaime Moreno (Rod Dyachenko 78), Luciano Emilio. Substitutes Not Used: Jose Carvallo, Ryan Cordeiro, Quavas Kirk, Franco Niell, Dan Stratford
- "I thought we outplayed them (in the first half). We created so many quality opportunities. But like I said, you have to finish even more of those. We could have been up two, three at the half – you have to put those chances away," Soehn said. "The good part is that we're creating those quality chances right now and every game I'm seeing it get better and better."

### TEAM NEWS

- After losing five consecutive away games and being outscored 12-1, United finally got a result on the road – and scored two goals.
- "We were up 2-0 and obviously we all wanted to win, so we're all disappointed we didn't get three points. We have to settle for one, but we're still taking it one step at a time," Soehn said. "Overall, I thought we deserved more, but we didn't take our chances to put the game away."
- After scoring in the second game of the season, Luciano Emilio went seven games without a goal. The 2007 MLS Golden Boot winner, with 20 goals last year, now has scored in each of the last two games.
- "He was a handful today. He's causing a lot of havoc. He's very opportunist on the goal he scored. It's unfortunately he didn't get more today," Soehn said.
- Even though United hit rock-bottom in the loss to Toronto on May 21, Soehn did not change his team for the second leg of their home-and-home series. And had not Gonzalo Peralta remained in the nation's capital in anticipation of the birth of his second child, Soehn likely would have maintained the same team for the third match running in New England. Peralta's wife gave birth to son Mateo on Friday, and he is expected to be available for the Houston match.
- "You know another thing that was good, Tommy stayed with the same lineup," said Santino Quaranta after the Toronto match. "I think it would've been easy for him to make changes early on in the second half, change the formation. But I think we all learned a lesson in staying patient in that game, so it worked out."
- Still, it was the second time in four games United let a lead slip away on the road, over the final stages of the match. Ahead 1-0 at Chivas USA, the home side scored three goals in a 10-minute span beginning in the 73rd minute to claim victory on May 17.
- "Obviously, we're protecting a two-goal lead and they're pushing everything they can to get it back. It's more of a situation where no matter what you get when you're up two goals, you're having a defensive mentality and they're throwing everything they can to get a goal," Soehn said.

### HOUSTON DYNAMO

The Houston Dynamo won for the first time in five games after a six-game winless run to start the season, defeating the New York Red Bulls 1-0 on Saturday evening at Robertson Stadium. The Dynamo now sit in a three-way for second place in the Western Conference, along with the Los Angeles Galaxy and Chivas USA, just a point behind the Colorado Rapids.

### LAST MATCH

- The Dynamo had followed their first two victories with a loss and a draw, though the draw saw a second stoppage-time equalizer against FC Dallas on the season. The Red Bulls came into the game off their second defeat in a row, this one an historic, 5-1 defeat by the Chicago Fire at home.
- Missing three key starters, including striker Juan Pablo Angel and playmaker Claudio Reyna, the Red Bulls held out for three-quarters of the match.
- But the Dynamo -- missing key starters of their own through international duty, injury and suspension -- finally broke through in the 68th minute. A ball was swung out wide to Geoff Cameron, and he curled a rolling, early cross into the goal area where Brian Ching came sliding in to poke home his third goal of the season, all in the last five games.
- Dynamo head coach Dominic Kinnear made four changes to the team that came back for a late 2-2 draw against FC Dallas at midweek. Tony Caig came in for Pat Onstad in goal and Corey Ashe replaced Dwayne De Rosario in the midfield as both were away on international duty. Patrick Ianni came in for the suspended Eddie Robinson in central defense and Ricardo Clark returned from international duty, taking the place of Kyle Brown.

- "A win is a win. We created some chances and I don't think they created much. It was a hard fought, physical game," Kinnear said. "I think we knew after the result that they got last week that they were going to come with a different mentality, and they did. We got a good effort from a lot of our guys, and I think we should be happy with the three points that we got."

### TEAM NEWS

- With all the changes in the team, Kinnear was pleased with how the group he had on the field responded to the challenge.
- "I think our young guys really worked hard tonight and ... the average age of our midfield was something like 23. You had Corey (Ashe), Geoff (Cameron), Stuart (Holden) and then Rico (Ricardo Clark) was the elder statesmen of the group at 25. Just the effort we got from them tonight was great."
- Equally credited were the changes in the back, where Patrick Ianni made his first start in four games in place of the suspended Eddie Robinson and Tony Caig made his first start since April 19. Ianni will likely again figure in central defense with the suspension to Robinson extended by a match in a decision by the MLS Disciplinary Committee.
- "After halftime, I think we needed a little bit more composure on the ball, and we did that in the second half. Pat Ianni was good tonight, Tony (Caig) was good and all of the guys that came in had a positive effect on the game," Kinnear said.
- The game was the second in a stretch of four games for the Dynamo in less than two weeks. After the United match, Houston will return home for a Sunday evening match against Toronto FC, then turn right around and face the New England Revolution on MLS Primetime Thursday next week.
- "The games are adding up, but I think we are doing a good job of rotating some guys and getting our rest off the field and making sure we are prepared for the games," said midfielder Stuart Holden. "We go out every game and give it 100 percent. At the end of the day, it all comes with the job."
- The trip to D.C. United will close out a difficult early part of the season for the Dynamo, where they have not played in front of their Robertson Stadium faithful much at all. Eight of their next 11 games will now be at home, and the trip to Washington is third road game in their last four.
- "If you look at our first 10 games, we had seven on the road, and in this league that is very difficult to play in," Ching said. "The way we started off, I think we were a little disappointed in how we started the season. But since then, we just put our heads down and have gotten back to playing how we are capable. Now we are working as a team and battling for results. I think in the past few games, you have really seen that."

## HISTORY VS. HOUSTON

United and the Dynamo have played each other four times since Houston's first year in 2006. All but one game has been decided by a single goal, as each team has won two games. Last year, D.C. beat Houston 2-1 at home on 5/26 and fell 1-0 at Robertson Stadium. Following Saturday's match, the two teams will face each other twice more - once in SuperLiga play on 7/19 and on 10/12 in League play.

## MODEST STREAK

Following a 2-2 draw in New England last Thursday (5/29), United has put together its first undefeated streak of 2008, having not lost in two games. The modest streak seems to be a step in the right direction for the Black-and-Red who earned their first road points of the season with the Revolution result.

## TWO FOR EMILIO

United forward Luciano Emilio has scored in each of United's last two games, bringing his season goals total to three. Emilio had not scored since the team's second game of the season - a 4-1 win over Toronto on 4/5 - and had gone seven games between goals. Previously, his longest streak without scoring was six games, 4/28/07 - 6/2/07.

## WIN #3

United earned its third victory of the year on 5/24 - a 3-2 result over visiting Toronto FC. D.C. came from behind twice and got goals from Gonzalo Peralta, Jaime Moreno (PK) and Luciano Emilio in the win. Prior to the win, United was 2-7 which was tied for the worst start in team history, as the '96 squad also began 2-7, but rebounded to win MLS Cup in the inaugural year.

## CLOSE TO FULL STRENGTH

United can be encouraged by the return of several players who have recently been out with injury. Fred - out since 4/26 (hamstring) - returned on 5/21 and played 74 minutes; Devon McTavish - out since 4/17 (mid-foot sprain) - returned to play 82 minutes on 5/21; and Domenic Mediate - out since 4/17 (hamstring strain) - returned on 5/17 and played 90 minutes. The team is still without Ben Olsen (ankle surgery), Jeff Carroll (toe surgery).

## EVERY MINUTE

After 11 games only two United players have played every minute - Bryan Namoff and Clyde Simms. Both have played 990 minutes in one spot - Namoff at right back and Simms at defensive midfield. They are two of only eight players in MLS who have played 990 minutes thus far in '08.

## RESERVES DRAW

The United Reserves played to a 1-1 draw in New England last Friday morning (5/30). Franco Niell scored for D.C. as the team's record moved to 1-2-1. The D.C. reserves will play Chicago's reserves on Sunday morning (6/8) at 10 a.m.

## DOE CALLED-UP

United forward Francis Doe was called-up by his native Liberia to participate in World Cup qualifiers. He departed D.C. on Sunday, May 25 and will return on Saturday, June 21. In the team's first game against Gambia, Doe played the final 29 minutes of the 1-1 draw. Liberia will also play Algeria on June 6 and twice against Senegal - June 15 and June 20.

## JEFF CURTIN RETIRES

United announced last week that defender Jeff Curtin has retired from professional soccer. The 24-year-old is leaving the game due to persistent groin injuries. Curtin signed a developmental contract with United on 4/17 after his rights were acquired via the 2008 MLS Waiver Draft. He played in a single reserve game for United after two seasons with the Chicago Fire.

## LEADING MAN

With a goal in United's 3-2 win over Toronto on 5/24, Jaime Moreno now sits in fourth place in the League's goals-scored table. Landon Donovan leads the way with nine, Kenny Cooper has six, Robbie Rogers has five and several players have four, including Moreno.

## GOAL KING MORENO

Moreno's goal - from the penalty spot - against Toronto on 5/24 increased his career goal total to 116, most in MLS regular season history. United's longest tenured player sits six goals ahead of Chivas USA's Ante Razov. His 36 penalty kick goals are most all-time, well ahead of Preki's 23.

## MORENO'S ASSISTANCE

With two assists in United's 4-1 win over Salt Lake on 4/26, Jaime Moreno increased his all-time assist total to 92, leapfrogging Cobi Jones and into fifth place all-time. With another assist against Toronto on 5/24 he now sits eight assists behind another United legend - Marco Etcheverry.

## DAS AUTO!

On 5/6, United and Volkswagen announced its five-year partnership, which includes the VW logo on the front of the team's jerseys. The long-term deal will see a number of exciting things for United's fans, including the VW Garage (located behind the north goal) with interactive areas and free parking for all fans to Thursday's game versus Chicago.

## CHAMPIONS LEAGUE

United is one of four MLS teams that will compete in the newly created CONCACAF Champions League. The tournament will be comprised of 24 teams representing each of CONCACAF's regions. Champions League will feature four teams from Mexico and USA; two clubs each from Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Panama; and one representative from Canada, Belize, and Nicaragua and three teams from the Caribbean. The preliminary round will begin in August.

## DCU-GALAXY TICKETS ON SALE

On Monday, 5/11, single game tickets for United's June 29 match with the LA Galaxy went on sale. With more than 20,000 tickets already sold and single tickets in the lower bowl sold out, fans hoping to attend the game are encouraged to buy soon. ## MORENO'S BIG GAME

Jaime Moreno put together one of his best games in recent years in the team's 4-1 win over Salt Lake on 4/26. The League's all-time leading goal-scorer notched two penalties and provided assists on the team's other two goals.

## RESERVES WIN FIRST GAME

United's reserve squad won their first game of the year on 4/18 - a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the visiting Columbus Crew. D.C. was down 2-0, but got second half goals from Dan Stratford, Jeremy Barlow and Ryan Cordeiro (in the 90th minute) to secure the win.

## MOOSE WAIVED

United waived Justin Moose on Tuesday, 4/15. The midfielder requested the move in order that he could sign with the USL-1's Vancouver Whitecaps. He was originally drafted by the club in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2006 MLS SuperDraft, making just one first team appearance (for one minute on the pitch) during his rookie year. Last year, he saw time in seven games (four starts), totaling 319 minutes on the field.

## OUSTED FROM CHAMPIONS' CUP

United has been ousted from CONCACAF Champions' Cup play, falling on aggregate 3-2 to Pachuca CF (Mexico). After falling in the first leg 2-0, D.C. fell short in the return leg at home, managing a 2-1 win, but falling in the series. In the second leg, United was down 1-0 before getting two late goals from Rod Dyachenko (85th minute) and Franco Niell (90th). The much-needed third goal did not come, however.

## CONCACAF CHAMPIONS' CUP HISTORY

United finished 2008's run with an all-time record of 12-5-3 in CONCACAF Champions' Cup play. The team has competed in the tournament more than any other MLS team, having previously participated in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2005 and 2007. United became the first MLS team to win Champions' Cup when it captured the title in 1998 by defeating Toluca. Last year, United advanced past CD Olimpia 7-3 on aggregate before falling in the semifinal round to CD Guadalajara 3-2 on aggregate.

## MAGNIFICENT MCTAVISH

D.C. United's Devon McTavish went on a tear in the first round of the CONCACAF Champions' Cup versus Harbour View, tallying three goals in two games. His first came in the team's 1-1 draw on 3/12 in Jamaica - his first career first team goal - before adding two more in the club's 5-0 throttling in the return leg at RFK Stadium on 3/18.

## INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

With the addition of a few players this year, United now has one of the most diverse teams in MLS. The club has players representing the following countries: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, England, Liberia, Peru, Russia and the U.S.

## BARLOW SIGNED

United obtained Jeremy Barlow from the Houston Dynamo in exchange for the club's natural third round selection in the 2009 MLS Supplemental Draft. On Thursday, March 20, the team signed the midfielder to a developmental contract. He was originally selected by the Dynamo in the fourth round (56th overall) of the 2008 MLS SuperDraft. Barlow is a product of the D.C. United Academy and played four seasons at the University of Virginia.

## KICKOFF LUNCHEON A SUCCESS

On Tuesday, March 25, United and its non-profit arm, United for D.C., held its sixth annual Kickoff Luncheon. The event, which featured MLS Commissioner Don Garber as the keynote speaker, **raised over \$42,000** for United for D.C.'s many community-minded initiatives.

## 2007 MLS RECAP

D.C. United enters the 2008 season following a 2007 campaign that was both successful and disappointing. The Black-and-Red added its eleventh major trophy to its case after putting together the best regular season record (16-7-7) in MLS and thus capturing the Supporters' Shield. Though the team failed to capture any additional hardware and fell short in MLS Cup playoffs - and missing out on a chance to play in MLS Cup at RFK Stadium - after being ousted by the Chicago Fire in the first round. The team scored the most goals (56) and had the best goal differential (+22) in the League.

## 2007 INDIVIDUAL HONORS

With the best regular season record came a number of individual awards for the members of United last year. Luciano Emilio took home three trophies, as the League's Golden Boot winner (for scoring the most goals - 20), the Newcomer of the Year and the League's MVP. Emilio was joined on the year-end Best XI list by teammate Ben Olsen and former teammate Christian Gomez.

### On the road again – Dynamo head to D.C., White House

The Houston Dynamo, two-time defending MLS Cup champions, return to Washington, D.C. for the first time since winning the 2007 MLS Cup title on November 18, 2007 with a 2-1 win over the New England Revolution. Houston will face D.C. United on Wednesday night and visit the White House on Thursday to be congratulated by President George W. Bush.

### Recent action: Dynamo down Red Bulls

Houston earned its third win in the last five games and improved to 3-1-2 in its last six games with a 1-0 win over the New York Red Bulls Saturday at Robertson Stadium. Missing four starters due to national team duty (De Rosario, Onstad), suspension (Robinson), and injury (Barrett), a Dynamo lineup that included **Brian Mullan** at forward dominated play against New York. The decisive play came in the 68th minute, when **Stuart Holden** played a quick free kick wide to rookie **Geoff Cameron**, who slid a cross to the back post, where **Brian Ching** slid to deflect it in. It was Ching's third goal in five games.

### Dynamo vs. D.C. United – series notes

- Houston is 3-2 all-time against D.C. United. All three wins have come at Robertson Stadium, while D.C. United is 2-0 against the Dynamo at RFK Stadium.
- History suggests the game will be low-scoring. D.C. United has won regular-season home contests against Houston 2-0 and 2-1, while Houston has won two league contests and a SuperLiga game, each by a 1-0 score.
- Houston has scored four goals against D.C. United in five games, three from **Brian Ching** and one from **Dwayne De Rosario**.
- In the series history, D.C. United has scored three of its four goals in the first 30 minutes of the game, while Houston has scored three of its four in the second half.
- Dynamo defender **Bobby Boswell** was MLS Defender of the Year in 2006 as part of his three-year stint with D.C. United. Forward **Guy-Roland Kpene** played for D.C. United last year. On the flip side, D.C. goalkeeper Zach Wells spent two years in Houston.

### Up Next: Dynamo host new and improved Toronto FC

Houston returns home for a Sunday game against a much improved Toronto FC side that is currently 5-3-2 on the. The game is on the same day as the United States-Argentina match, which means U.S. coach Bob Bradley could influence the game by taking both, one, or neither of the midfield duo of Houston's Ricardo Clark and Toronto's Maurice Edu.



### **Captain consistent could miss more time**

Left back **Wade Barrett**, the team's captain since its inception, has missed the last two games with a left adductor strain and could miss Wednesday's contest. He had played in 59 consecutive MLS and MLS Cup playoff games before missing the Wednesday, May 28 game.

Barrett has been a remarkable fixture in the Dynamo lineup over the last two-plus years. Of the team's 97 games in competitive competitions (MLS, playoffs, Open Cup, Champions' Cup, SuperLiga), Barrett has started 93. Before May 28, he had only missed a game in 2006 due to yellow card accumulation and the Open Cup contest in 2007, in which most starters were rested.

### **Scoring first would help**

In 70 games in Major League Soccer this season (through Sunday), teams scoring first are 51-5-10, with four games ending in scoreless ties. The Dynamo are 3-0-2 when scoring first but have led for just 120 minutes this year out of 1,350 and have not held a lead for more than 31 minutes in any game.

### **Dynamo players go international**

As two-time defending MLS Cup champions, Dynamo players are understandably in demand for their national teams. Midfielder **Corey Ashe** recently returned to the team after playing in all three games on the United States U-23 national team's trip to the prestigious Toulon International Tournament in France. Midfielder **Ricardo Clark** missed the Dallas game while playing for the United States senior national team against England. Midfielder **Dwayne De Rosario** and goalkeeper **Pat Onstad** missed Saturday's game to play for Canada in its 3-2 loss to Brazil in a friendly, but both will return for this week's games next week against D.C. United and Toronto FC. Absences will likely continue, however, as CONCACAF World Cup qualifying continues.

### **Onstad among elite company**

Dynamo goalkeeper **Pat Onstad** joined an elite club of MLS goalkeepers on May 17, making four saves in the win over Chicago to run his career total to 500 saves, the ninth goalkeeper in league history to do so. Onstad has now reached 506 career saves, passing Mark Dougherty for eighth in league history. The Canadian international, now 40 years old, has the best career goals against average in MLS history with a mark of 1.09. Onstad led the league last year by allowing 0.82 goals per 90 minutes and finished second with 11 shutouts.

### **Dynamo Reserves top West standings**

The Dynamo Reserves are in first place in the Western Conference of the MLS Reserve Division with a 3-0-1 record. Forward **Kyle Brown** is tied for the MLS Reserve Division lead with three goals and two assists, while **Chris Wondolowski** is one of just five players with three goals. Houston will resume Reserve Division play June 22 at Colorado.

### **Where's Waibel?**

A quick check of the record books reveals that Dynamo right back **Craig Waibel** is virtually indispensable. With Waibel on the field, Houston has an all-time record of 31-15-20 in all competitions, including a 1-0-2 record this season after Saturday's win. The Dynamo are 10-11-10 all-time without the fan favorite in the starting lineup or as a substitute.
