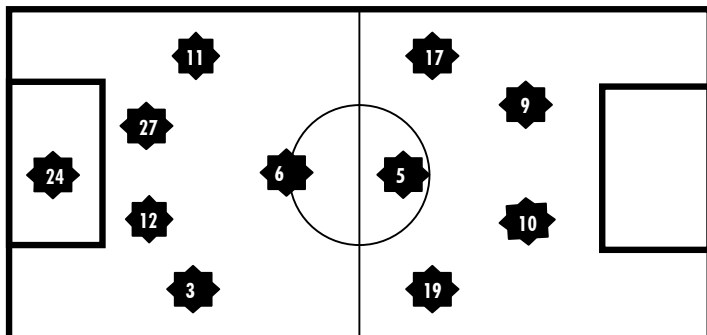

RED BULLS VS. TORONTO FC

- The Red Bulls hope to end the 2009 Regular Season with three points when they take on Toronto FC in the third meeting between the sides.
- Toronto FC needs a win to have a chance of securing its first-ever MLS postseason berth and is coming off a 1-0 home victory over Real Salt Lake.
- The New York-Toronto FC showdown will be the last-ever soccer match played at Giants Stadium. The Red Bulls are moving to Red Bull Arena, located in Harrison, NJ, for the 2010 season.

RED BULLS TAKE ON TFC IN LAST GAME AT GIANTS STADIUM: The New York Red Bulls wrap up their 2009 Regular Season when they play their last game at Giants Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 24, facing Toronto FC at 7:30 PM ET (TV: MSG 2; Radio: WADO 1280 AM).

The New York MLS franchise has played its home games at Giants Stadium since the League's first season in 1996. The Red Bulls will move into their brand new stadium, Red Bull Arena, in Harrison, NJ next year. Saturday's match against Toronto FC will be the last soccer match ever played at Giants Stadium – a facility that has hosted a World Cup, multiple international matches and a variety of other soccer events.

NEW YORK LOOKS TO END SEASON ON A HIGH: The Red Bulls take on a Toronto FC squad that is looking to clinch its first-ever playoff spot. With one game remaining, Toronto FC is in a logjam at 39 points, tied with four other teams for the last spot in the MLS playoffs and one point behind the seventh-placed Colorado Rapids.

Meanwhile, the Red Bulls are looking for three points to end the season and snap a two-game losing streak and five-game winless run. New York did not play over the weekend, but is coming off a 2-0 loss to Real Salt Lake last Wednesday, Oct. 14 at Rio Tinto Stadium. New York returns home for its finale after playing three-straight road games against Western Conference opponents. Its last match at Giants Stadium was a 1-1 tie with the New England Revolution on Sept. 18. The Red Bulls are currently 4-6-4 at the Meadowlands this season.

Toronto FC earned a crucial 1-0 win over Real Salt Lake at BMO Field last Saturday, with captain Jim Brennan providing the game's lone goal while goalkeeper Brian Edwards made nine stops to earn the shutout. Toronto FC has won the first two matches between the two teams. On June 13, Toronto FC earned a 2-1 win at BMO Field. Red Bulls midfielder Albert Celades scored for New York in that match. Eleven days later, Toronto FC again beat New York at BMO Field, this time by a score of 2-0. New York has a 3-4-1 record all-time against their Canadian rival and is 2-1-0 at Giants Stadium.

RED BULLS TO HONOR ANGEL, PETKE FOLLOWING MATCH: The Red Bulls will recognize forward Juan Pablo Angel and defender Mike Petke for reaching a pair of milestones following the team's game against Toronto FC on Saturday.

Angel will be honored for breaking the club's record for goals scored in all competitions after he tallied his 46th goal in New York's 1-1 tie with Chivas USA on Sept. 26. Angel has 46 goals in all competitions, 43 of which were scored in the regular season. He scored his 46th goal in just his 78th appearance, garnering a strike rate of 0.59 goals per match. Angel surpassed Clint Mathis, who needed 100 appearances to reach 45 goals. Angel also eclipsed the team's regular season goal mark of 41, scoring his 42nd in just 68 matches (0.60 goals per regular season game).

In that same match against Chivas USA, Petke moved into the Top-10 in all-time minutes played in MLS history, passing forward Mark Chung with his 90-minute performance. Over the course of Petke's 12 MLS campaigns with New York, D.C. United and Colorado, he has seen 24,729 minutes of action. Originally drafted by New York in the first round of the 1998 MLS SuperDraft, Petke is in his second stint with the club. Petke leads the club in games played (152) and started (146).

RED BULLS DOWNED BY RSL: The New York Red Bulls defense was under pressure most of the night from a Real Salt Lake team desperate for points to keep their postseason hopes alive, and the Red Bulls kept Salt Lake off the scoreboard for 80 minutes before conceding two late goals in a 2-0 defeat on Wednesday, Oct. 14 at Rio Tinto Stadium in the final road match of the season for New York.

Two early offsides calls on Fabian Espindola let New York know Real Salt Lake was going to attack early and often. Espindola had the first chance of the match in the sixth minute, putting a shot from the edge of the area into side netting. Real Salt Lake carried play for much of the

first half, creating several dangerous scoring chances, but Danny Cepero was up to the task each time.

In the 12th minute following a Red Bull foul, Javier Morales bent a free kick from 30 yards out that Cepero pushed wide with a full extension dive to his left. Just past the half hour mark, Espindola snaked a shot between two defenders that Cepero was able to get in front of, but he could not control the rebound. However, he was able to parry aside Yura Movsisyan's follow from close range. Off the ensuing corner kick, Will Johnson found the ball at his feet 25 yards from goal, but Cepero made an athletic kick save reaching back to his left to keep the ball out of the net.

Macoumba Kandji had New York's best chance of the first half in the 35th minute, breaking wide into the area on the left side with room to shoot, but his pushed his try from an acute angle wide.

Just before the break, Espindola again challenged Cepero, placing one towards the far corner, but Cepero was able to get his fingertips on it to push it wide, keeping the game scoreless into the half. Celades attempted to chip Nick Rimando in the area off a Jeremy Hall back heel, but he put the ball onto the top of the goal.

Salt Lake pressured the New York end relentlessly in the second half, but the Red Bull defensive unit held strong during several sustained efforts before Real Salt Lake finally got on the board in the 80th minute. On a counter after a Carlos Johnson shot was blocked by Jamison Olave in the Salt Lake area, Robbie Findley carried the ball down the right side a hit a cross that Andy Williams knocked past Cepero with a sliding shot to give Real Salt Lake the lead.

With New York pushing forward, Espindola put the game away in the 90th minute, curling a shot past Cepero to the far post.

COUNDOUL RETURNS FROM NATIONAL TEAM DUTY: Red Bulls goalkeeper Bouna Coundoul was called up to the Senegalese National Team for their friendly against South Korea in Seoul on Oct. 14, but did not play. Coundoul missed the Red Bulls' 2-0 loss to Real Salt Lake on Wednesday, Oct. 14 and was replaced by goalkeeper Caleb Patterson-Sewell, who was signed after New York received League approval for a case of extreme hardship.

Coundoul has earned three caps for Senegal and has made seven starts for the Red Bulls, earning a 1.43 goals against average.

BOYENS GOES FOR WORLD CUP BERTH: Red Bulls defender Andrew Boyens was called up to the New Zealand National Team for the first leg of its 2010 World Cup Qualifying two-leg playoff against Bahrain. The first leg took place in Bahrain's National Stadium in Manama on Oct. 10 – a game New Zealand tied 0-0. Boyens, who did not play in the match, re-joined New York last week in time to play 90 minutes against Real Salt Lake on Oct. 14.

The All Whites host the second leg at Westpac Stadium in Wellington on Nov. 14. The winner of the series will qualify for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. Boyens has earned 12 caps for his national team and competed at the FIFA Confederations Cup in South Africa for New Zealand last summer. New Zealand qualified for this final playoff stage after winning the Oceania qualifying zone last year. The 26-year-old has started in 13 games this season for New York.

ANGEL TOP SCORER SINCE 2007: Over the past three seasons, since Angel joined the League from Aston Villa as New York's second Designated Player in April 2007, he has been MLS' most prolific goal scorer in the regular season.

RED BULLS TO OPEN RED BULL ARENA VS. FIRE: The New York Red Bulls will open Red Bull Arena on Saturday, March 27, 2010, when they host the Chicago Fire at 7:00 PM ET for the start their 2010 MLS Regular Season slate. The game will be telecast nationally on ESPN2. The match is just 184 days away as of Sept. 23 and will be the first MLS game in the new stadium.

"We are excited to be opening Red Bull Arena on the first weekend of MLS action," said Red Bulls Managing Director Erik Stover. "Red Bull Arena will provide an unparalleled experience for our fans and players. The inaugural match will be a special evening and we look forward to showcasing our new stadium."

Easily accessible by public transportation and located in a diverse soccer hotbed, Red Bull Arena, located in Harrison, NJ, is expected to be one of the premier venues of its kind in the United States. Vertical

construction on the 25,000-seat venue started in August 2008. With seats as close as seven yards from the touchline and located underneath a dynamic 360-degree roof, Red Bull Arena will be the ultimate sporting experience for soccer and casual fans alike. The Red Bulls' opener will be the first match of a 30-game schedule, which will be released by the League in full prior to the kickoff of next season.

TWO CALLED UP TO U.S. U-17 WORLD CUP SQUAD: Red Bull Academy products John Agudelo and Keith Cardona have each been named to US U17 Head Coach Wilmer Cabrera's 21-player roster for the upcoming FIFA U17 World Cup, beginning Oct. 26 in Nigeria. Agudelo, a forward was with the team during qualifying, while Cardona, a goalkeeper, is making his U17 MNT debut. The New York Red Bulls Academy is the only program in the country to have two players named to the U17 World Cup roster. The USA will play the first two group games against Spain on Oct. 26 and Malawi on Oct. 29, in Kano before moving to Ijebu-Ode to close out the first round against UAE on Nov. 1.

WOLYNIEC, GOLDY UNDERGO SURGERY: The New York Red Bulls announced that forward John Wolyniec and defender Kevin Goldthwaite underwent season-ending surgeries two weeks ago.

Wolyniec underwent left ankle surgery Tuesday, Oct. 6, to remove two bone chips. The procedure was performed by Dr. David Levine at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York, NY. Wolyniec sustained the injury after scoring a goal-tying in New York's 1-1 draw against the New England Revolution on Sept. 18. He is expected to miss six weeks. Second all-time in club history in games played with 138, Wolyniec, 32, has scored two goals and an assist in 20 appearances – eight of which were starts – this season.

Goldthwaite had a left adductor release procedure performed by Dr. William Meyers in Philadelphia, PA, on Wednesday, Oct. 7. His recovery time was expected to be three to eight weeks. Goldthwaite, 26, was acquired from Toronto FC in the middle of the 2007 season and has started in 17 games for the Red Bulls in 2009. He was New York's 2008 Defender of the Year after playing in a career-high 28 games and tallying two goals and two assists.

WILLIAMS AT THE HELM: Red Bulls interim head coach Richie Williams, who took the helm after the resignation of Juan Carlos Osorio on Aug.

21, is now 2-3-2 this season and 5-6-4 all-time. Williams guided the Red Bulls to two-straight wins in late August over FC Dallas (Aug. 23) and Columbus Crew (Aug. 30) and helped New York earn its first point on the road since April 11 (0-0 tie at Houston) with a 1-1 draw against Chivas USA on Sept. 26.

CELADES A FATHER: Red Bulls midfielder Albert Celades became a father on Wednesday, Oct. 7, as his wife gave birth to a baby girl.

FIRST FANS PICK SEATS FOR RED BULLS ARENA: The first 100 Red Bulls season ticket holders selected their seat locations at Red Bull Arena – Built by Makita on Wednesday, Sept. 23. Five groups of 20 were escorted into Red Bull Arena throughout the afternoon and were able to select their exact seat locations in the stadium. All 100 season ticket holders have been with the team, without interruption, since the franchise's inaugural season in 1996.

"Today marks another important milestone for the Red Bulls and Red Bull Arena," said Red Bull New York Managing Director Erik Stover. "Our first 100 season ticket holders selected their new seats in Red Bull Arena. They have waited a long time for this day and it will be just a few short months before the stadium is completed and ready for the upcoming 2010 MLS season."

First to select his seats was Herb Weltig of Sleepy Hollow, New York. "It'll be very exciting to be in our own home," said Weltig. "We'll have noisy crowds here and have a winning season next year and for many years after."

"It feels like we've arrived," said Tyson Hoeflinger, of Hightstown, New Jersey, who was ninth in line and purchased six season tickets. "Next year will be like our first year. Today we were able to get a view of the sight lines and what it will be like next year."

Additional Construction Notes: Since the last construction update, the installation of the field's drainage and heating systems are nearing completion. In addition, the last layers of dirt and gravel are being spread before the Kentucky Bluegrass field is to be laid down in October. The roof panel installation continues and the north and south ends have been completed.

CHIRGADZE BECOMES CLUB'S FIRST HOMEGROWN PLAYER: Red Bull New York announced on Sept. 11 that it has signed Red Bull Academy forward Giorgi Chirgadze, as he becomes the first homegrown player produced by the club.

"This is an exciting time for Red Bull with the signing of Giorgi Chirgadze. We believe Giorgi will be the first of many players to join our first team that are developed through our academy system," said Sporting Director Jeff Agoos. "Giorgi has shown promise during his training sessions with our senior squad and we are excited to track his development moving forward."

Chirgadze, 18, has been with the Academy program since 2005, when he joined the Under-15 squad. Most recently, the Brooklyn, NY, native helped the Red Bulls U-20 team win the Super-20 National Championship, as Chirgadze scored twice in the tournament. Chirgadze also captained the Red Bulls U-17 side that defeated the Inter Milan U-17 team, 3-1, on Aug. 23, 2008, with the forward providing two of the three goals. He attended New Utrecht High School in Brooklyn, NY.

"It has always been my dream to play soccer professionally and I want to thank the Red Bulls and the coaches at the Academy for their help in developing me as a player both on and off the field," Chirgadze said. "I am excited to get started with the first team."

In July 2009, the MLS Board of Governors approved an amendment to the rules governing the signing of youth academy players. MLS clubs will receive two additional roster slots that may be used to sign academy players, in accordance with current Home Grown Player rules, to Generation adidas or Developmental contracts during the 2009 season. These players will not count toward the 24-player roster limit in 2009. Additionally these players may not play in League games during the 2009 season, but can participate in training, exhibition games and CONCACAF Champions League games. These additional player signings will count toward a team's roster upon the commencement of the 2010 season.

PACHECO CONTRACT TERMINATED: Red Bull New York announced on Sept. 14 that it has terminated the loan deal and contract for defender Alfredo Pacheco, effective immediately. BOUNA TIME!: After enduring a rough start to his Red Bulls career, conceding six goals in two games, goalkeeper Bouna Coundoul earned

the team's first shutout since New York's 2-0 home win over Real Salt Lake on April 18 with New York's 1-0 win over Columbus on Aug. 30. Coundoul recorded one save officially, but made a number of key punches and plays to preserve the clean sheet against an offense that was tied for the most goals in MLS heading into that weekend. Coundoul was signed by New York on June 29, 2009, after his rights were acquired from the Colorado Rapids in exchange for allocation money. Coundoul started his career with the Rapids in 2005 and featured in 52 games.

RED BULLS MARK ONE-YEAR OF ARENA CONSTRUCTION: Aug. 19 marked the one-year anniversary of the day in which the first piece of structural steel was erected at Red Bull Arena – the Red Bulls' future home slated to open in 2010 in Harrison, NJ. The monumental step last year started the vertical construction stage of the process in building the arena. On April 14, 2009, the Red Bulls held a "topping off" ceremony to place the final piece of steel at Red Bull Arena, marking the end of vertical construction. The first complete roof section at Red Bull Arena was finished on Aug. 4. The roof panels extend 120 feet from the facade over the seating bowl with the final 60 feet composed of translucent panels. These translucent panels will allow natural light to pass through into the bowl. In total, there will be 94 panels used to complete the Red Bull Arena roof. When completely installed, the roof will extend over the entire seating bowl and curve down to the concourse.

RED BULLS SIGN GARCIA: Red Bull New York announced on Aug. 17 that it has signed defender Walter Garcia. The 25-year old joins New York from Quilmes Atlético Club of the Argentinean Second Division. Garcia began his career with Argentino Juniors in 2001, making 51 appearances over three seasons before moving on to Club Atlético San Lorenzo de Almagro to make 61 appearances and scoring three goals. In 2006, he played briefly for FC Rubin Kazan in Russia and later Calcio Catania in Italy before returning to Argentina to play for Quilmes in 2007, appearing in 14 matches and scoring one goal. He was capped for the Argentina Under-20 side in the 2003 FIFA World Youth Championship and the 2003 South American Youth Championship, which was won by the Argentine team.

JOHNSON RETURNS: After being out for three months dealing with a fractured fifth metatarsal, Red Bulls defender Carlos Johnson made his return on Aug. 15 in New York's 2-0 loss to Chivas USA. Johnson played the first half before coming out with a lower back contusion. He underwent successful surgery on May 19 to repair a fractured fifth metatarsal in his left foot, suffered on Saturday, May 16 in the Red Bulls' 1-1 tie against the Houston Dynamo after a tackle from Houston's Stuart Holden in the 21st minute and had to be substituted out of the game.

AGOOS INTO HOF: Jeff Agoos received his red jacket and joined the National Soccer Hall of Fame in the Induction 2009 Ceremony on Aug. 2 in Oneonta, NY. The ceremony concluded a whirlwind of recognition and activities at the Oneonta-based museum that began with the announcement of their election on a Fox Soccer Channel broadcast in January. Agoos is a 5-time MLS Cup Champion, winning in 1996, 1997, and 1999 with D.C United and in 2001 and 2003 with the San Jose Earthquakes. He is second on the U.S. Men's National team list of games played.

OEBSTER NETS FIRST: New York Red Bulls midfielder Ernst Oebster made his team debut against W Connection on Thursday, July 30, and he made an immediate impact, scoring New York's first goal in the team's 2-2 first leg draw. In addition, defender Alfredo Pacheco caused

New York's second goal when his blast was knocked into the goal by W Connection defender Elijah Joseph. The Red Bulls signed Oebster on July 16. The 25-year old joins New York from sister club Red Bull Salzburg. Oebster began his career with Salzburg in 2001 and has played for the first team as well as the Red Bull Junior with the exception of the 2003-04 season, when he played on loan for LASK Linz. The left-footed player helped Red Bull Salzburg to two Austrian Bundesliga titles (2007 and 2009) and has made 55 appearances for the club, scoring five goals. Ryan Kinne (Naugatuck, CT) scored his first of two goals just three minutes into the contest off a cross from Steven Amaya (Elmhurst, NY). Kinne scored his second from the penalty spot after Steven Rose (South Orange, NJ) was taken down in the box after 19 minutes. John Tardy (Staten Island, NY) added the third goal before half-time and the rout was on. The Red Bulls kept on the pressure in the second half and goals from Tevin Jackson (Jersey City, NJ), Sam Petrone (Glen Rock, NJ), Cesar Blacido (Ramsey, NJ), and Matt Uy (New Hyde Park, NY) rounded out the scoring in what turned out to be a lopsided final. Sheldon Parkinson (Bronx, NY) made a couple big saves early in the first half to help keep the clean sheet. Tardy received Super-20 League Most Valuable Player honors, scoring three goals to help lead the U20s to the National Championship.

RED BULLS WAIVE SMITH: Red Bull New York announced on July 30 that it waived midfielder Khano Smith. Smith, 28, played in eight games this season for New York, starting in six. He was signed by the Red Bulls during the off-season on Feb. 12 from Seattle Sounders FC in exchange for allocation money. The Bermudian made his Red Bulls debut on March 28 vs. New England at Giants Stadium, and provided the cross that caused a Revolution own goal in the 1-1 draw.

MENDES UNDERGOES SEASON-ENDING SURGERY: Red Bull New York announced that defender Carlos Mendes underwent season-ending surgery to repair a torn hip labrum on July 14. The surgery was performed by Dr. Bryan T. Kelly at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City. Mendes, who has carried the injury since Aug. 2008, will miss six months and will be placed on the team's Season-Ending Injury List. Mendes played in 12 games this season, starting in 11. The Mineola, NY, native has been with the team since 2005 and has made 107 appearances for the New York – ninth-most all-time in club history.

CELADES TALLIES FIRST: New York Red Bulls midfielder Albert Celades had some reason to celebrate on June 13, as he scored his first MLS goal in New York's 2-1 loss to Toronto FC. Celades received the ball from Juan Pablo Angel at the top of the penalty box, stepped around his defender and hit a left-footed shot in side the post. Celades has played in nine games for New York, starting in seven. He has also tallied one assist after missing the early part of the season due to paperwork and injury issues. A former Real Madrid and FC Barcelona player, Celades trained with the club in the preseason and was signed by New York on March 11, 2009.

CLUB DEALS ODURO TO HOUSTON: Red Bull New York announced on May 27 that it acquired the Houston Dynamo's highest 2010 first round MLS SuperDraft pick and highest 2011 second round MLS SuperDraft pick in exchange for forward Dominic Oduro. The Red Bulls also announced that it waived goalkeeper Terry Boss. The Red Bulls now have two first round picks in the 2010 SuperDraft.

SEEING RED: The Red Bulls are 26-35-8 when they receive a red card. They have received five red cards this season and have gone 2-3-2 in those matches.

FIRST FOUR SETS RECORD: The New York Red Bulls' four goals scored in the opening 45 minutes of their 4-1 win over the San Jose Earthquakes on May 8 set a club record for most goals scored in the first half.
